



WHAT IS THE OCTAVE OF EASTER?

The Octave of Easter is one of the lesser known liturgical celebrations in the Catholic Church. It includes Easter Sunday and the seven days that follow, culminating in the celebration of Divine Mercy Sunday (also known as the Second Sunday of Easter).

Starting from at least the 3rd or 4th century, Christians began to extend certain feasts beyond the initial day. This meant that the joyous celebrations of Easter Sunday were prolonged and lasted a full eight days.

In fact, Christians treated each day in the octave as if it were Easter Sunday. This tradition has been preserved by the Roman Rite and many of the Eastern Rites, where the liturgical readings and actions of each day mimic what happened on Easter Sunday... The Octave of Easter remains a celebratory time for Christians around the world and is meant to be a joyous time to remain in the beauty of the Lord's resurrection.

As with the way Christmas is celebrated in the Catholic Church, the Easter season only begins with Easter Sunday. It is a season for feasting, praising God and enjoying the company of family and friends. Gone are the fasting days of Lent! (Even the weekly Friday abstinence, which many Catholics practice all year long, is suspended on Easter Friday.) Now is the time to feast!

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Dear Friends,

Hallelujah! He is risen!

Happy Easter, my dear parishioners! This is not the Easter any of us envisioned. I envisioned a packed church, families in their Sunday best, children all over the rectory lawn chasing hidden eggs, and our choir belting out the Gloria and Handel's Messiah until the roof blew off. Alas, the Lord has steered us elsewhere. In this unexpected voyage that we've taken as a parish during this just concluded Lenten season, I have been edified by your resiliency. The number of people seeing our Masses on Facebook and YouTube exceeds regular Mass attendance. Many of our ministries are meeting online via Zoom. Our Spanish Marriage Covenant ministry even completed a virtual retreat this past week conducted by Deacon Fleitas. The doors of our church may be closed, but our parish is very much alive! As Archbishop Gomez of Los Angeles put it last week: "Our churches may be closed, but Christ is not quarantined, and his gospel is not in chains."

Still, many of us are still worried which is natural. We want to return to church and to the sacraments, and believe me, your priests want to receive you too. Sadly, we are still called to wait. It's as if Lent has been prolonged a bit more and the desert has no end in sight. But today we must still celebrate. We must celebrate that Christ vanquished sin and death. We must celebrate that our Lord is alive. We must celebrate that we have nothing to fear. Remember what the angel told the women who had gone to Jesus' tomb that first Easter morning: "Do not be afraid! I know that you are seeking Jesus the crucified. He is not here, for he has been raised just as he said (Matthew 28:5-6)." We must not fear! He told us he would rise, and he did. He told us he would be with us always, and he has. The desert always brings hunger and thirst, and our exile from the Eucharist has brought us deeper hunger for Christ in the Blessed Sacrament and unquenchable thirst for the living Word of God.

So we are asked to journey through the desert some more, but we are not afraid, and we are not alone by any means. Earlier this week, I was contemplating the most significant event that occurred during Lent: the "Urbi et Orbi" blessing of our Holy Father, Pope Francis. The image of him walking in the rain in an empty square and then blessing the city and the world with the monstrance is stirring. We did the same the evening when we were asked to close at the steps of our church. The Pope reminded us on that rainy Rome night two weeks ago:

The Lord asks us and, in the midst of our tempest, invites us to reawaken and put into practice that solidarity and hope capable of giving strength, support and meaning to these hours when everything seems to be floundering. The Lord awakens so as to reawaken and revive our Easter faith. We have an anchor: by his cross we have been saved. We have a rudder: by his cross we have been redeemed. We have a hope: by his cross we have been healed and embraced so that nothing and no one can separate us from his redeeming love. In the midst of isolation when we are suffering from a lack of tenderness and chances to meet up, and we experience the loss of so many things, let us once again listen to the proclamation that saves us: he is risen and is living by our side.

He is risen! Nothing else matters. May this Easter Sunday remind us of one irrefutable fact of our faith: the victory is Christ's and His alone! We share in this victory, and whatever storm we may be traveling through, and we're travelling through a doozy of a storm right now, our Lord will protect us, guide us, and lead us to the new dawn that awaits when our church doors finally open to receive His Easter people.

Mis Queridos Amigos,

iAleluya! iÉl ha resucitado!

iFeliz Pascua de Resurrección mis queridos feligreses! Esta no es la Pascua que ninguno de nosotros imaginamos. Imagine una iglesia abarrotada, familias con sus mejores vestidos de domingos, niños por todo el jardín de la rectoría buscando huevos escondidos y nuestro coro cantando el Gloria y el Mesías de Handel hasta que se volara el techo. Por desgracia, el Señor nos ha guiado a otra parte. En este viaje inesperado que hemos tomado como parroquia durante esta temporada cuaresmal recién concluida, su resistencia me ha edificado. El numero de personas que ven nuestras Misas en Facebook y en YouTube excede la asistencia regular a las Misas. Muchos de nuestros ministerios se reúnen conectados a través de Zoom. Nuestro ministerio del Convenio Matrimonial en español incluso completo un retiro virtual la semana pasada dirigido por el Diacono Fleitas. iLas puertas de nuestra iglesia pueden estar cerradas, pero nuestra iglesia está muy viva! Como dijo el Arzobispo Gómez de Los Ángeles la semana pasada: "Nuestras iglesias pueden estar cerradas, pero Cristo no esta en cuarentena y su evangelio no esta encadenado".

Aun así, muchos de nosotros estamos preocupados todavía, lo cual es natural. Queremos volver a la iglesia y a los sacramentos y créanme, sus sacerdotes también quieren recibirlos a ustedes. Lamentablemente, todavía estamos llamados a esperar. Es como si la Cuaresma se hubiera prolongado un poco mas y el desierto no tuviera un final a la vista. Pero hoy todavía debemos celebrar. Debemos celebrar que Cristo venció el pecado y la muerte. Debemos celebrar que Nuestro Señor esta vivo. Debemos celebrar que no tenemos nada que temer. Recuerden lo que el ángel le dijo a las mujeres que habían ido a la tumba de Jesús esa primera mañana de Pascua: "No tengan miedo! Se que están buscando a Jesús el crucificado. El no esta aquí, porque ha resucitado tal como dijo (Mateo 28:5-6)". iNo debemos temer! Nos dijo que resucitaría y así lo hizo. Nos dijo que siempre estaría con nosotros, y así lo ha hecho. El desierto siempre trae hambre y sed, y nuestro exilio de la Eucaristía nos ha llevado a tener un hambre más

profunda por Cristo en el Santísimo Sacramento y una sed insaciable por la Palabra viva de Dios.

Por lo tanto, se nos pide que recorramos el desierto un poco más, pero no tenemos miedo y no estamos solos de ninguna manera. A principios de esta semana, estaba contemplando el evento más significativo que ocurrió durante la Cuaresma: la bendición "Urbi et orbi" de nuestro Santo Padre, el Papa Francisco. La imagen de el caminando bajo la lluvia en una plaza vacía y luego bendiciendo a la ciudad y al mundo con la custodia es muy conmovedora. Hicimos lo mismo en los escalones de nuestra iglesia la noche en que nos pidieron cerrar. El Papa nos recordó en esa noche lluviosa de Roma hace dos semanas:

El Señor nos interpela y, en medio de nuestra tormenta, nos invita a despertar y a activar esa solidaridad y esperanza capaz de dar solidez, contención y sentido a estas horas donde todo parece naufragar. El Señor se despierta para despertar y avivar nuestra fe pascual. Tenemos un ancla: en su Cruz hemos sido salvados. Tenemos un timón: en su Cruz hemos sido rescatados. Tenemos una esperanza: en su Cruz hemos sido sanados y abrazados para que nadie ni nada nos separe de su amor redentor. En medio del aislamiento donde estamos sufriendo la falta de los afectos y de los encuentros, experimentando la carencia de tantas cosas, escuchemos una vez más el anuncio que nos salva: ha resucitado y vive a nuestro lado.

iÉl ha resucitado! Nada mas importa. Que este Domingo de Resurrección nos recuerde un hecho irrefutable de nuestra fe: ila victoria es de Cristo y solo de Él! Compartimos esta victoria y cualquier tormenta que estemos atravesando, y estamos atravesando una tormenta dificultosa en este momento, Nuestro Señor nos protegerá, nos guiara y nos conducirá al nuevo amanecer que nos espera cuando las puertas de nuestra iglesia se abran finalmente para recibir a Su pueblo de Resurrección.
