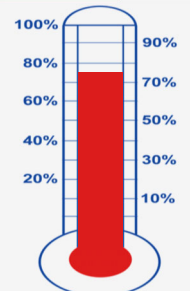

## FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK DEL ESCRITORIO DEL PÁRROCO

### MY DEAR PARISH FAMILY:

"...let this holy building shake with joy."

Those words from the Easter Proclamation, the Exultet, move me every year when I sing them or hear them at the Easter Vigil. On the night when we celebrate the greatest event in human history, the Resurrection of Jesus Christ, we gather to lift our voices in praise. And this phrase from the Easter Proclamation becomes quite literal when the Gloria is sung and the bells of the church ring in unison with the people's voices as they sing the angelic hymn celebrating the Resurrection.

This feeling is not contained to one night or to Easter Sunday. Every Sunday is, so to speak, a mini-Easter. We gather on Sunday for Mass precisely because the Lord rose from the dead on the first day of the week. So, when we gather for Mass, we should be ready to let our glorious church, this architectural wonder of a building, shake with the joy of a believing people who have come to worship the Risen Christ and to be fed from his hand at the altar of sacrifice.

The reason I point these truths out is because I have noticed that many in our community of faith choose to be passive participants instead of active participants in the Mass. Let me be a bit more frank since I preached on this last week: At the 5:30pm Sunday evening Mass, I have noticed since my arrival here almost two years ago that it was a very transient Mass. Yes, we have some parishioners who are faithful every week, but for the most part, the rest of the congregation comes and goes depending on how their schedules work out that day or because they missed Mass in the morning or because (fill in excuse here). That's what leads us to what we call a "transient Mass." I could very well be celebrating Mass at the airport for travelers going through. In a parish, it does not and should not work that way.

The Mass is where we establish community and where we strengthen the bonds of our parish family. Last fall, I made the decision to invite a youth choir to sing at the 5:30pm Mass, and they have been very well received. However, being warmly received and actually joining the choir in worship are two different things. I walked into that Mass last week and as I processed down the aisle, I noticed that not a single person was singing a very simple refrain. My father reminded me of an old saying a priest friend of ours who recently passed away used to say: "We go to Mass not to be entertained, for that, you go the theater. We go to Mass to be fed!" As a preacher and as a pastor, I know when my flock is not being fed or better stated, not wanting to be fed. Halfway through my homily at 5:30pm last Sunday, I veered way off course to remind the congregation of this reality: that we are here not to be passive but to be active participants at Mass and to then go forth to tell the world the great news that Jesus Christ is Risen!

I will state categorically here in our bulletin what I said last Sunday: last Fall I made a pastoral decision to make the 5:30pm Sunday Mass our parish youth Mass. I have found that many of our older parishioners have taken great joy in this Mass and pray fervently that our youth may attend more frequently and participate. This will hopefully lead to a flourishing youth ministry. The Church of the Little Flower will no longer cede youth ministry to neighboring parishes. Our youth are here! There's 900 of them across the street in our school and another 300 in our Religious Education program. Let us create an environment that is welcoming to them! Yes, each Mass has its particular character and charism, but the central essence is there: Jesus Christ waiting for us! May we make this holy building shake with joy every time we come to Mass, and if you want to be part of the great endeavor of our youth Mass then join us. But let's leave the passive attitudes at home because when it comes to conquering the souls of this young generation for Christ, we need active worshippers in Mass with a sense of urgency to proclaim the Risen Jesus to the young! This is indeed a bold endeavor which is why at the end of my homily I turned to the image of the Divine Mercy and simply said, "Jesus, I trust in you!"

### MI QUERIDA FAMILIA PARROQUIAL:

"... que este edificio sagrado se sacuda de alegría."

Esas palabras de la Proclamación pascual, el Exultet, me conmueven cada año cuando las canto o las escucho en la Vigilia Pascual. En la noche en que celebramos el acontecimiento más grande de la historia humana, la resurrección de Jesucristo, nos reunimos para elevar nuestras voces en alabanza. Y esta frase de la Proclamación pascual se vuelve bastante literal cuando se canta el Gloria y las campanas de la iglesia suenan al unísono con las voces del pueblo mientras cantan el himno angelical que celebra la Resurrección.

Este sentimiento no está contenido a una noche o al Domingo de Pascua. Todos los domingos es, por así decirlo, una mini-Pascua. Nos reunimos el domingo para la misa precisamente porque el Señor resucitó de entre los muertos el primer día de la semana. Por lo tanto, cuando nos reunimos para la misa, debemos estar listos para dejar que nuestra gloriosa iglesia, esta maravilla arquitectónica de edificio, se sacuda con la alegría de un pueblo creyente que ha venido a adorar a Cristo resucitado y a ser alimentado de su mano en el altar del sacrificio.

La razón por la que señalo estas verdades es porque he notado que muchos en nuestra comunidad de fe eligen ser participantes pasivos en lugar de participantes activos en la Misa. Permítanme ser un poco más franco desde que prediqué sobre esto la semana pasada: En las misas de 5:30 pm del domingo por la noche, he notado desde mi llegada aquí hace casi dos años que es una misa muy transitoria. Sí, tenemos algunos feligreses que son fieles cada semana, pero en su mayor parte, el resto de la congregación vienen y van dependiendo de cómo funcionen sus horarios ese día o porque se perdieron la misa por la mañana o porque (llenen la excusa aquí). Esto es lo que nos lleva a lo que llamamos una "misa transitoria". Muy bien podría estar celebrando la misa en el aeropuerto para los viajeros que van pasando. En una parroquia, no funciona ni debe funcionar de esa manera.

La misa es donde establecemos comunidad y donde fortalecemos los lazos de nuestra familia parroquial. El otoño pasado, tomé la decisión de invitar a un coro juvenil a cantar a las 5:30 pm, y han sido muy bien recibidos. Sin embargo, ser recibido calurosamente y unirse al coro en adoración son dos cosas diferentes. Entré en esa misa la semana pasada y mientras procesaba por el pasillo, me di cuenta de que ni una sola persona estaba cantando un estribillo muy simple. Mi padre me recordó a un dicho viejo que un sacerdote amigo nuestro que recientemente falleció solía decir: "Vamos a misa no para ser entretenidos, para eso, vamos al teatro. ¡Vamos a misa para ser alimentados!" Como predicador y como párroco, sé cuándo mi rebaño no está siendo alimentado o, mejor dicho, no querer ser alimentado. A mitad de mi homilía a las 5:30 pm del domingo pasado, me desvié del camino para recordarle a la congregación esta realidad: ¡que estamos aquí no para ser pasivos, sino para ser participantes activos en la misa y luego salir a decirle al mundo la gran noticia de que Jesucristo ha resucitado!

Voy a decir categóricamente aquí en nuestro boletín lo que dije el domingo pasado: el último otoño tomé la decisión pastoral de hacer la misa dominical de las 5:30 pm nuestra misa juvenil parroquial. He descubierto que muchos de nuestros feligreses mayores han tomado con gran alegría esta misa y oran fervientemente para que nuestros jóvenes asistan con más frecuencia y participen. Con suerte, esto conducirá a que florezca nuestro ministerio de la juventud. La Iglesia de Santa Teresita ya no cederá el ministerio juvenil a las parroquias vecinas. ¡Nuestros jóvenes están aquí! Hay 900 de ellos al otro lado de la calle en nuestra escuela y otros 300 en nuestro programa de Educación Religiosa. ¡Vamos a crear un ambiente que sea acogedor para ellos! Sí, cada misa tiene su carácter particular y carisma, pero la esencia central está ahí: ¡Jesucristo esperándonos! Que hagamos temblar este edificio sagrado con alegría cada vez que venimos a misa, y si quieren ser parte del gran esfuerzo de nuestra misa juvenil, entonces únense a nosotros. ¡Pero dejemos las actitudes pasivas en casa porque cuando se trata de conquistar las almas de esta generación joven para Cristo, necesitamos adoradores activos en misa con un sentido de urgencia para proclamar al Jesús resucitado a los jóvenes! Esto es, de hecho, un esfuerzo audaz, por lo que al final de mi homilía me volteé hacia la imagen de la Divina Misericordia y simplemente dije: "¡Jesús, confío en ti!"

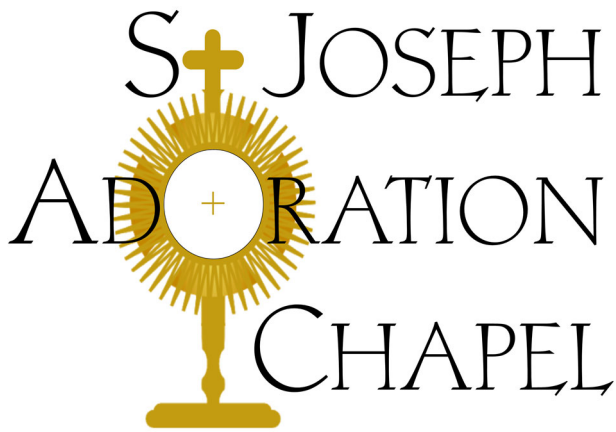

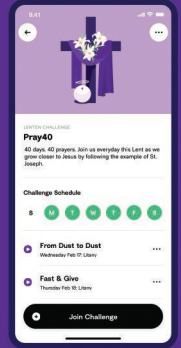

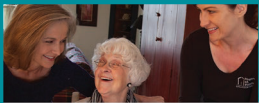
