

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

My Dear Friends,

Today we bring our liturgical year to a close with the Solemnity of Christ the King. The primary question I always ask the faithful on this day is this: "Does Christ reign in your heart?" Not part of it, not on certain days of the week, but does he completely reign in your heart, in your life, in your home and everywhere you go? This is at the center of today's celebration. Which brings me to a wonderful catechesis on the origins of today's solemnity which I found published by the U.S. Bishops that I would like to share with all of you:

On the last Sunday of each liturgical year, the Church celebrates the Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe, or Christ the King.

Pope Pius XI instituted this feast in 1925 with his encyclical Quas primas ("In the first") to respond to growing secularism and atheism. He recognized that attempting to "thrust Jesus Christ and his holy law" out of public life would result in continuing discord among people and nations. This solemnity reminds us that while governments come and go, Christ reigns as King forever.

During the early twentieth century, in Mexico, Russia, and some parts of Europe, militantly secularistic regimes threatened not just the Catholic Church and its faithful but civilization itself. Pope Pius XI's encyclical gave Catholics hope and — while governments around them crumbled — the assurance that Christ the King shall reign forever. Jesus Christ "is very truth, and it is from him that truth must be obediently received by all mankind" (Quas primas, 7).

Christ's kingship is rooted in the Church's teaching on the Incarnation. Jesus is fully God and fully man. He is both the divine Lord and the man who suffered and died on the Cross. One person of the Trinity unites himself to human nature and reigns over all creation as the Incarnate Son of God. "From this it follows not only that Christ is to be adored by angels and men, but that to him as man angels and men are subject, and must recognize his empire; by reason of the

hypostatic union Christ has power over all creatures" (Quas primas, 13).

The Church calls us to acknowledge Christ's kingship with our whole lives:

He must reign in our minds, which should assent with perfect submission and firm belief to revealed truths and to the doctrines of Christ. He must reign in our wills, which should obey the laws and precepts of God. He must reign in our hearts, which should spurn natural desires and love God above all things, and cleave to him alone. He must reign in our bodies and in our members, which should serve as instruments for the interior sanctification of our souls, or to use the words of the Apostle Paul, 'as instruments of justice unto God.'-Quas primas, 33

Today, religious freedom for many people means that we can believe whatever we want in private, but when we enter the public square or the marketplace, we may not speak of anything that relates to our faith. However, the Church acknowledges the reign of Christ, not only privately, but publicly. This solemnity encourages us the celebrate and live out our faith in public. "Thus by sermons preached at meetings and in churches, by public adoration of the Blessed Sacrament exposed and by solemn processions, men unite in paying homage to Christ, whom God has given them for their King" (Quas primas, 26).

For Christians, when our faith is repeatedly marginalized in public life, we can fall into the habit of compartmentalizing our lives. We love Jesus in our private lives, but we shrink from acknowledging the kingship of Christ in social life. When we celebrate the Solemnity of Christ the King, we declare to the world and remind ourselves that Jesus is the Lord of the Church and of the entire universe. --USCCB

Long live Christ the King! ¡Viva Cristo Rey! .

DEL ESCRITORIO DEL PÁRROCO

Mis queridos amigos,

Hoy cerramos nuestro año litúrgico con la solemnidad de Cristo Rey. La pregunta principal que siempre hago a los fieles en este día es esta: "¿Reina Cristo en tu corazón?" No en una parte, no en ciertos días de la semana, pero ¿reina completamente en tu corazón, en tu vida, en tu hogar y dondequiera que vayas? Esto es el centro de la celebración de hoy. Lo que me lleva a una catequesis maravillosa sobre los orígenes de la solemnidad de hoy, que encontré publicada por los obispos de los Estados Unidos, que me gustaría compartir con todos ustedes:

El último domingo de cada año litúrgico, la Iglesia celebra la solemnidad de Nuestro Señor Jesucristo, Rey del Universo, o Cristo Rey.

El Papa Pío XI instituyó esta fiesta en 1925 con su encíclica Quas primas ("En el primero") para responder al creciente secularismo y ateísmo. Reconoció que intentar "expulsar a Jesucristo y su santa ley" de la vida pública resultaría en una discordia continua entre las personas y las naciones. Esta solemnidad nos recuerda que mientras los gobiernos van y vienen, Cristo reina como Rey para siempre.

A principios del siglo XX, en México, Rusia y en algunas partes de Europa, los regímenes militantemente secularistas amenazaron no solo a la Iglesia Católica y sus fieles, sino a la civilización misma. La encíclica del Papa Pío XI dio esperanza a los católicos y, mientras los gobiernos a su alrededor se derrumbaban, la seguridad de que Cristo Rey reinará para siempre. "Él es la Verdad y porque los hombres necesitan beber de Él y recibir obedientemente la verdad" (Quas primas, 7).

La realeza de Cristo está arraigada en la enseñanza de la Iglesia sobre la Encarnación. Jesús es completamente Dios y completamente hombre. Él es tanto el Señor divino como el hombre que sufrió y murió en la Cruz. Una persona de la Trinidad se une a la naturaleza humana y reina sobre toda la creación como el Hijo encarnado de Dios. "De donde se sigue que Cristo no solo deber ser adorado en cuanto Dios por los ángeles y por los hombres, sino que, además, los unos y los otros están sujetos a su imperio y le deben obedecer también en cuanto hombre; de manera que por el solo hecho de la unión hipostática, Cristo tiene potestad sobre todas las criaturas" (Quas primas, 13).

La Iglesia nos llama a reconocer la realeza de Cristo con toda nuestra vida:

"Es, pues, necesario que Cristo reine en la inteligencia del hombre, la cual, con perfecto acatamiento, ha de asentir firme y constantemente a las verdades reveladas y a la doctrina de Cristo; es necesario que reine en la voluntad, la cual ha de obedecer a las leyes y preceptos divinos; es necesario que reine en el corazón, el cual, posponiendo los efectos naturales, ha de amar a Dios sobre todas las cosas, y solo a Él estar unido; es necesario que reine en el cuerpo y en sus miembros, que como instrumentos, o en frase del apóstol San Pablo, como armas de justicia para Dios" (Quas primas, 33)

Hoy en día, la libertad religiosa para muchas personas significa que podemos creer lo que queramos en privado, pero cuando entramos en la plaza pública o en el mercado, no podemos hablar de nada que se relacione con nuestra fe. Sin embargo, la Iglesia reconoce el reinado de Cristo, no sólo en privado, sino públicamente. Esta solemnidad nos anima a celebrar y vivir nuestra fe en público. "Así, por medio de discursos en las asambleas y en los templos, de la adoración, en común, del augusto Sacramento públicamente expuesto y de solemnísimas procesiones, proclamar a Cristo como Rey que nos ha sido dado por el cielo" (Quas primas, 26).

Para los cristianos, cuando nuestra fe es repetidamente marginada en la vida pública, podemos caer en el hábito de compartimentar nuestras vidas. Amamos a Jesús en nuestras vidas privadas, pero evitamos reconocer la realeza de Cristo en la vida social. Cuando celebramos la solemnidad de Cristo Rey, lo declaramos al mundo y recordamos que Jesús es el Señor de la lalesia y de todo el universo. --USCCB

UPDATES COMING TO OUR ENVELOPE SYSTEM FOR 2023

My dear friends,

As we approach the end of the calendar year, we are processing our offertory collection envelopes for 2023. Here's the thing: we send out, through a service, over 3,400 envelopes to all our parishioners every year, BUT, on average, less than 300 envelopes are used on Sundays during the offertory. Some also drop them off in the office, or mail them in, for which we are extremely grateful. Printing these envelopes comes at a great expense to the parish, though. Last year we spent over \$18,000 in the printing and mailing of these envelopes to all of you. *This is not sustainable*. The decline of envelope use is mainly due to the growth of online giving during the pandemic which has helped increase our weekly collection from pre-pandemic levels. But it would not be good stewardship on my part as your pastor to continue paying for envelopes that are never being used.

Last week, our dedicated staff went through all our records as to who is faithfully using the offertory envelopes during this last year. We winnowed that number down from almost 3,500 to closer to 750. So what this means is that only those people who use the envelopes faithfully will receive them in the first mailing for 2023. Now, it stands to reason that in this process someone may have been left out. If you don't get your envelopes come January and still want to receive them, simply call the office and we can reactive the envelopes for you. Similarly, some of you may receive envelopes but decide you want to opt-out and that can also be done easily. Not getting envelopes does not affect your status as an active parishioner at Little Flower. This small change will actually help your parish redirect funds for the myriad of repairs our building has to undergo in the coming year. Thank you for your cooperation and for your continued financial support of your parish. **God bless, Father Manny**



2ND COLLECTION THIS WEEKEND: CAMPAIGN FOR HUMAN DEVELOPMENT


