

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

My Dear Friends,

Jesus is coming! In one week, we'll be gathering to celebrate the birth of the Messiah. The question is, are you ready?

As I mentioned a month ago, we have been blessed this year to celebrate the full four weeks of Advent, but now that we're getting towards the end, Christmas seems to be creeping up on us. So many details left undone, gifts left unwrapped, cards left unmailed. While all of that is well and good, what are we doing to prepare our hearts? This last week is crucial for our spiritual preparation for Christmas.

Today the Church presents us with the figure of St. Joseph. He had plans and dreams for his new bride, but all of that gave way to God's plan. All of us probably have big plans for next week, but is Jesus included in them? St. Joseph lived his entire life placing Jesus and our Blessed Mother first. His dreams took a backseat to God's will for his life. At the end of today's gospel, we hear that Joseph wasted no time in preparing for Jesus: "When Joseph awoke, he did as the angel of the Lord had commanded him and took his wife into his home (Matthew 1:24)." He welcomed Mary and in turn welcomed Jesus, the Divine Word, into his new family, the Holy Family.

So let us emulate St. Joseph this final week of Advent and prepare properly for Christmas. On Monday, we will have an Advent night of reflection in our church led by our Archdiocesan Father Matthew Gomez. Vocations Director, 7:30pm. On Wednesday, at December 21. at 7:00pm, we will have our Advent Penance Service with Individual Confessions. We will have multiple priests available that night until the last confession is heard. This is the perfect week to have our hearts cleansed in the Sacrament of Penance. Please take the time to do a good Examination of Conscience. Prepare yourself for this sacrament. Invoke the Holy Spirit to make a good confession this week. It will be the greatest Christmas gift you can give yourself and to others!

Finally, some practical advice: don't sweat the small stuff. We get so stressed as Christmas is approaching over who's coming over for Noche Buena (Christmas Eve) dinner, whose gifts are ready, travel plans, etc. Put Jesus first. Everything else will take care of itself. Since Christmas falls on a Sunday this year, no special Christmas Mass schedule is needed. All the Masses will be celebrated at their normal times on Saturday and Sunday (Christmas Eve and Christmas Day). Obviously, we add the Midnight Mass on Saturday night which at Little Flower is celebrated as the name says...at Midnight! Come early and listen to choir's magnificent Christmas our prelude. Yes, Christmas is almost here. We are very much in need of a Savior. Spend the week praying about what you need him to save you from. Ask St. Joseph for his intercession as we prepare for the coming of the Christ Child!

- *Oh, St. Joseph, whose protection is so great, so prompt, so strong, before the throne of God, I place in you all my interests and desires.*
- *Oh, St. Joseph, do assist me by your powerful intercession, and obtain for me from your divine son all spiritual blessings, through Jesus Christ, our Lord.*
- So that, having engaged here below your heavenly power, I may offer my thanksgiving and homage to the most loving of fathers.
- *Oh, St. Joseph, I never weary contemplating you and Jesus asleep in your arms; I dare not approach while he reposes near your heart.*
- Press him in my name and kiss his fine head for me and ask him to return the kiss when I draw my dying breath.
- *St. Joseph, patron of departed souls pray for me. Amen.*

Mis queridos amigos,

¡Jesús viene! En una semana, nos reuniremos para celebrar el nacimiento del Mesías. La pregunta es, ¿están listos?

Como mencioné hace un mes, hemos sido bendecidos este año de celebrar las cuatro semanas completas de Adviento, pero ahora que estamos llegando al final, la Navidad parece estar avanzando hacia nosotros. Tantos detalles sin hacer, regalos sin envolver, tarjetas sin enviar. Si bien todo eso está bien, ¿qué estamos haciendo para preparar nuestros corazones? Esta última semana es crucial para nuestra preparación espiritual para la Navidad.

Hoy la Iglesia nos presenta la figura de San José. Tenía planes y sueños para su nueva novia, pero todo eso dio paso al plan de Dios. Todos nosotros probablemente tenemos planes grandes para la próxima semana, pero ¿está Jesús incluido en ellos? San José vivió toda su vida colocando a Jesús y a nuestra Santísima Madre en primer lugar. Sus sueños pasaron a un segundo plano frente a la voluntad de Dios para su vida. Al final del evangelio de hoy, escuchamos que José no perdió tiempo en prepararse para Jesús: "Cuando José despertó del sueño, hizo lo que el ángel del Señor le había mandado, y tomo a Maria por esposa (Mateo 1:24)". Acogió a María y, a su vez, acogió a Jesús, el Verbo Divino, a su nueva familia, la Sagrada Familia.

Así que emulemos a San José esta última semana de Adviento y preparémonos adecuadamente para la Navidad. El lunes, tendremos una noche de reflexión de Adviento en nuestra iglesia dirigida por nuestro director de Vocaciones Arquidiocesanas, el Padre Matthew Gómez, a las 7:30 pm. El miércoles 21 de diciembre, a las 7:00 pm, tendremos nuestro Servicio de Penitencia de Adviento con Confesiones Tendremos varios Individuales. sacerdotes disponibles esa noche hasta que se escuche la última confesión. Esta es la semana perfecta para limpiar nuestro corazón con el Sacramento de la Penitencia. Por favor, tómese el tiempo para hacer un buen examen de conciencia. Prepárense para este sacramento. Invoquen al Espíritu Santo para que

hagan una confesión buena esta semana. ¡Será el mejor regalo de Navidad que pueden darse a sí mismo y a los demás!

Por último, algunos consejos prácticos: no se preocupen por las cosas pequeñas. Nos estresamos tanto a medida que se acerca la Navidad sobre quién viene a la cena de Noche Buena, qué regalos están listos, planes de viaje, etc. Pongan a Jesús primero. Todo lo demás se encargará de sí mismo. Dado que la Navidad cae en domingo este año, no se necesita un horario especial para la Misa de Navidad. Todas las misas se celebrarán en su horario normal el sábado y el domingo (Nochebuena y Navidad). ¡Obviamente, agregamos la Misa de Medianoche del sábado por la noche que en Santa Teresita se celebra como su nombre lo dice ... a medianoche! Vengan temprano y escuchen el magnífico preludio navideño de nuestro coro. Sí, la Navidad ya casi está aguí. Estamos muy necesitados de un Salvador. Pasen la semana orando acerca de lo que necesitan que Él los salve. ¡Pídanle a San José su intercesión mientras nos preparamos para la venida del Niño Jesús!

- *Oh san José, cuya protección es tan grande, tan fuerte y tan inmediata ante el trono de Dios, a ti confío todas mis intenciones y deseos.*

IS YOUR PARISH REGISTRATION UP TO DATE?





With the end of the year quickly approaching, now is the perfect time to double check that your parishioner registration information is accurately updated. Registered parishioners receive a unique envelope number for tracking tax-deductible donations and those listed as active should have recently received our annual Christmas card mailing. If you don't have an envelope number or didn't receive the Christmas card, we may not have you formally registered or we may have an inaccurate mailing address listed!

Registering as a new parishioner **or** updating your family/contact information can be done online or right from your smart devices! Click the "Registration" option in the menu of our parish website (www.COTLF.org), follow the step by step instructions to create an access username and password and, once verified by the parish office, you'll be granted full access to update your family record.

With your "*My Own Church*" log-in, you'll be able to review your family member and contact information, easily provide any updates, find your envelope number, review your annual contribution history, and more. As always, you are also welcome to call or visit the parish office for any assistance with registering or updating your contact information.



Thanks to the overwhelming generosity of our parishioners, visitors, and friends this year, we were able to proactively address several maintenance and upkeep projects needing attention around the parish. From the air conditioning units in Comber Hall to the sound system in the church to the general maintenance of our almost 100-year-old office center, rectory house and school, minor problems were able to be fixed or replaced before they had the chance to become major problems. These are only the "tip of the iceberg" of areas needing attention, however.
