

THE FOLLOWING IS POPE FRANCIS' REGINA CAELI ADDRESS FROM APRIL 26, 2020

Dear Brothers and Sisters, Good Morning!

Today's Gospel, which takes place on the day of the Passover, describes the episode of the two disciples of Emmaus (Lk 24:13-35). It is a story that begins and ends on the move. There is in fact, the outbound journey of the disciples who, saddened by the epilogue of Jesus' story, leave Jerusalem and return home to Emmaus, walking some 11 kilometers. It is a journey that takes place during the day, much of it downhill. And there is the return journey: another 11 kilometers, but at nightfall, partly an uphill journey after the fatigue of the outward journey and the entire day. Two trips: one easy in daytime, and the other tiring at night. Yet the first takes place in sadness, the second in joy. In the first one, there is the Lord walking beside them, but they do not recognize him; in the second one they do not see him anymore, but they feel him near them. In the first they are discouraged and hopeless; in the second they run to bring the good news of the encounter with the Risen Jesus to the others.

The two different paths of those first disciples tell us, Jesus' disciples today, that in life we have two opposite directions before us: there is the path of those who, like those two on the outbound journey, allow themselves to be paralyzed by life's disappointments and proceed sadly; and there is the path of those who do not put themselves and their problems first, but rather Jesus who visits us. and the brothers who await his visit, that is, our brothers who are waiting for us to take care of them. Here is the turning point: to stop orbiting around one's self; the disappointments of the past, the unrealized ideals, the many bad things that have happened in our life. Very often we tend to keep going around and around.... To leave that behind and to go forward looking at the greatest and truest reality of life: Jesus lives, Jesus loves me. This is the greatest reality. And I can do something for others. It is a beautiful reality: positive, bright, beautiful! This is the turning point: to go from thoughts about I to the reality of my God; going – with another play on words – from "if" [se in Italian] to "yes" [sì in Italian]. From "if" to

"yes". What does this mean? "If he had freed us, if God had listened to me, if life had gone as I wanted, if I had this and that...", in a tone of complaint. This "if" is not helpful, it is not fruitful. It helps neither us nor others. Here are our "ifs", similar to those of the two disciples, whom however, move to a yes: "Yes, the Lord is alive, he walks with us. Yes, we continue our journey to announce it now, not tomorrow". "Yes, I can do this for the people so that they may be happier, so that people may better themselves, to help many people. Yes, yes I can". From "if" to "yes", from complaints to joy and peace, because when we complain, we are not joyful; we are in the grey, greyness, that grey air of sadness. And this does not help nor allow us to grow well. From "if" to "yes"; from complaints to the joy of service.

How did this change of pace, from "I" to "God", from "if" to "yes", occur within the disciples? By meeting Jesus: the two disciples of Emmaus first open their hearts to him, then they listen to him explain the Scriptures and then they invite him home. These are three steps that we too can take in our homes: first, opening our hearts to Jesus, entrusting him with the burdens, the hardships, the disappointments of life, entrusting the "ifs" to him, and then, the second step, listening to Jesus, taking the Gospel in hand, reading this passage in chapter 24 of Luke's Gospel on this very day; third, praying to Jesus, in the same words as those disciples: "Lord, 'stay with us' (v. 29). Lord, stay with me. Lord, stay with all of us, because we need you to find the way". And without you, there is night.

Dear brothers and sisters, we are always journeying in life. And we become what we go towards. Let us choose the way of God, not of self; the way of "yes", not the way of "if". We will discover that there are no unexpected events, no uphill path, no night that cannot be faced with Jesus. May Our Lady, Mother of the journey, who by receiving the Word made her entire life a "yes" to God, show us the way.

LO SIGUIENTE ES EL DISCURSO DEL REGINA CAELI DEL SANTO PADRE FRANCISCO DEL 26 DE ABRIL, 2020

Queridos hermanos y hermanas, ¡buenos días!

El Evangelio de hoy, ambientado en el día de Pascua, cuenta el episodio de los dos discípulos de Emaús (cf. Lucas 24, 13-35). Es una historia que comienza y finaliza en camino. De hecho, narra el viaje de ida de los discípulos que, tristes por el epílogo de la historia de Jesús, abandonan Jerusalén y regresan a casa, a Emaús, caminando alrededor de once kilómetros. Es un viaje que tiene lugar durante el día, con gran parte del viaje cuesta abajo. Luego tiene lugar el viaje de regreso: otros once kilómetros, pero recorridos al caer la noche, con parte del viaje cuesta arriba después de la fatiga del viaje de ida y todo el día. Dos viajes: uno fácil durante el día y el otro agotador por la noche. Sin embargo, el primero tiene lugar en la tristeza, el segundo en la alegría. En el primero está el Señor caminando a su lado, pero no lo reconocen; en el segundo ya no lo ven, pero lo sienten cerca de ellos. En el primero están desanimados y desesperanzados; en el segundo corren para llevar a los demás la buena noticia del encuentro con Jesús Resucitado.

Los dos diferentes caminos de aquellos primeros discípulos nos dicen, a los discípulos de Jesús de hoy, que en la vida tenemos ante nosotros dos direcciones opuestas: hay un camino de los que, como aquellos dos del principio, se dejan paralizar por las desilusiones de la vida y siguen tristemente; y hay un camino de los que no se ponen a sí mismos y sus problemas en primer lugar, sino a Jesús que nos visita, y a los hermanos que esperan que nos ocupemos de ellos. Este es el punto de inflexión: deiar de orbitar alrededor de uno mismo, de las decepciones del pasado, de los ideales no realizados, de las muchas cosas malas que han sucedido en la vida de uno. Tantas veces nos dejamos llevar por ese dar vueltas y vueltas... Déjalo y sigue adelante con la mirada puesta en la realidad más grande y verdadera de la vida: Jesús está vivo, Jesús me ama. Esta es la mayor realidad. Y puedo hacer algo por los demás. ¡Es una hermosa realidad, positiva, solar, bella! La inversión de marcha es ésta: pasar de los pensamientos en torno a mí mismo a la realidad de mi Dios; pasar -con otro juego de palabras- del "si" al

"sí". Del "si" al "sí". ¿Qué significa eso? "Si Él nos hubiera liberado, si Dios me hubiera escuchado, si la vida hubiera sido como yo quería, si tuviera esto y aquello...", en tono de queja. Este "si" no ayuda, no es fecundo, no nos avuda ni a nosotros ni a los demás. Aquí están nuestros "si", similares a los de los dos discípulos... Pero pasan al sí: "sí, el Señor está vivo, camina con nosotros. Sí, ahora, y no mañana, nos ponemos en marcha de nuevo para anunciarlo". "Sí, puedo hacer esto para que la gente sea más feliz, para que la gente sea mejor, para ayudar a tanta gente. Sí, sí, puedo". Del si al sí, de las quejas a la alegría y a la paz, porque cuando nos quejamos, no estamos en la alegría; estamos grises, grises, ese aire gris de tristeza. Y eso ni siguiera nos ayuda a crecer bien. De si a sí, de la gueja a la alegría del servicio.

Este cambio de paso, de yo a Dios, del si al sí, ¿cómo ocurrió en los discípulos? Encontrándose con Jesús: los dos de Emaús primero le abren su corazón; luego le escuchan explicar las Escrituras; luego le invitan a su casa. Son tres pasos que también nosotros podemos dar en nuestras casas: primero, abrir el corazón a Jesús, confiándole las cargas, las dificultades, las desilusiones de la vida, confiándole los "si"; y luego, segundo paso, escuchar a Jesús, tomar el Evangelio en mano, leyendo hoy mismo este pasaje, en el capítulo veinticuatro del Evangelio de Lucas; tercero, rezar a Jesús, con las mismas palabras de aquellos discípulos: "Señor, «quédate con nosotros». (v. 29). Señor, quédate conmigo. Señor, quédate con todos nosotros, porque te necesitamos para encontrar el camino. Y sin ti es de noche".

Queridos hermanos y hermanas, en la vida siempre estamos en camino. Y nos convertimos en aquello hacia lo que vamos. Escojamos el camino de Dios, no el camino del ego; el camino del sí, no el camino del si. Descubriremos que no hay ningún imprevisto, no hay cuesta arriba, no hay ninguna noche que no se pueda afrontar con Jesús. Que Nuestra Señora, Madre del Camino, que al aceptar la Palabra hizo de toda su vida un "sí" a Dios, nos muestre el camino.


MEN'S EMMAUS RETREAT

CHILD ABUSE PREVENTION MONTH

This is part four of a five-part series for April, Child Abuse Prevention Month. The Local Coordinator at ADOM entities oversee compliance of the Safe Environment Policy and also serve as the liaison between their site and the archdiocesan administrative offices working to provide reports and information as requested by independent auditors. This is accomplished through continuous communication with the Safe Environment Offices to check status of background checks, Virtus accounts, and the latest processes for running reports and numbers. If a policy changes or a process is updated they in turn need to guide, navigate, and accelerate those changes on site. Especially when talking about internet safety, it is imperative we utilize the most current tools, resources, and techniques at our fingertips — literally. Last year's audit report indicates over 8,000 employees, nearly 2,500 educators, 324 priests, 122 deacons,53 candidates for ordination, and over 51,000 volunteers received the adults Virtus training. Also over 43,000 children received the Virtus Teaching Boundary Safety lessons. For both the adult and the children's training every click and response is documented. 
