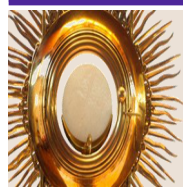

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

My Dear Friends,

On this Pentecost Sunday, I want to write to you about something that is vital to our celebration of the Mass: singing! You may be asking yourself why I am writing about this particular topic on Pentecost when I could have written a catechesis on the Holy Spirit, the birth of the Church, the proclamation of the kerygma, or any number of things, but the Holy Spirit moved me last week to write about singing during Mass. Why? Because, put simply: as a community we don't sing!

We do so many things well here at Little Flower. We educate children brilliantly in the faith as we have just concluded our Religious Education year and are about to conclude the school year at St. Theresa. We have excelled in hospitality since the pandemic started welcoming new members to our church. We are a generous community giving of our time, talent, and treasure. Our music ministers do a magnificent job of giving us liturgical music that raises our souls to the divine. But there is just one thing missing. We need to join them as they sing. So many times, it feels like we perceive them as mere entertainers that we like to listen to instead of liturgical ministers who dedicate so much of their time to rehearse to lead us all in song.

The Catechism of the Catholic Church lists three principal criteria for music to fulfill its liturgical purpose in Mass: "beauty expressive of prayer, the unanimous participation of the assembly at the designated moments, and the solemn character of the celebration (1157)." I want to focus on the second criterion which is the unanimous participation of the assembly. Yes, I know that all of us weren't gifted with angelic voices, but we're still called to sing. I remember as a child my father, who definitely was not blessed with a great singing voice (sorry, Dad), singing at full throat during Mass as an example for the rest of his family. We followed suit.

There is a great article online at aleteia.org by a Catholic composer JP Mauro about singing at Mass that says: "We are called as Catholics to bear witness to Christ, to participate in the Mass, and to be in communion with one another. Singing in one voice with our community fosters unity and brings us closer to God."

He also addresses the question of what if I can't sing? "Whether you have a voice that's meant for televised singing competitions or not, your voice was placed in this world by the Creator. As strange as it is to say, in this instance, your opinions on your vocal prowess are irrelevant. Singing at Mass is not a matter of pride, but a chance to lay ourselves bare to Christ. Once this is understood, it actually takes a lot of the pressure off. Now we can be like the holy fools who deliberately flouted society's conventions to serve a religious purpose."

And what happens if you don't like singing? Well, he addresses that too: "Some people just plain don't like to sing. There's nothing wrong with this, but the Catechism still instructs us to sing in "full participation." Rather than bemoan one's fate, it is wise to acknowledge that this is your cross to bear. This is a chance for you to take an uncomfortable moment and, as your granny may have instructed you, "Kiss it up to God."

Our music ministers want you to join them. Yes, I am aware that some of the songs, especially at the 10:30am Mass, may be a bit out of reach for us, but let's start with something simple: the Mass parts. Our music ministry in all the Masses has been singing the same Mass part melodies (Gloria, Alleluia, Holy, etc.) for almost three years. We should know them by now. Sing these parts of the Mass since they are an integral part of our liturgical prayer. As a celebrant, it's sometimes deflating when you tell your people to lift up their hearts and to join the choir of angels and just get blank stares looking back at you as the choir is singing.

So don't be afraid. Don't be embarrassed. On this Pentecost Sunday, the Holy Spirit, who is always calling us to change, is calling us to lift up our voices unanimously to sing the praises of our magnificent God who on this day gifted us the Spirit. Remember the great quote from St. Augustine: "He who sings, prays twice!"

DEL ESCRITORIO DEL PARROCO

Mis Queridos Amigos,

En este domingo de Pentecostés, quiero escribirles sobre algo que es vital para nuestra celebración de la Misa: ¡cantar! Usted puede estar preguntándose por qué estoy escribiendo sobre este tema en particular en Pentecostés cuando podría haber escrito una catequesis sobre el Espíritu Santo, el nacimiento de la Iglesia, la proclamación del kerigma, o cualquier cantidad de cosas, pero el Espíritu Santo me movió la semana pasada a escribir sobre el canto durante la Misa. ¿Por qué? Porque, en pocas palabras: ¡como comunidad no cantamos!

Hacemos muchas cosas bien aquí en Little Flower. Educamos a los niños brillantemente en la fe, ya que acabamos de concluir nuestro año de educación religiosa y estamos a punto de concluir el año escolar en Santa Teresa. Nos hemos destacado en hospitalidad desde que la pandemia comenzó en dar la bienvenida a nuevos miembros a nuestra iglesia. Somos una comunidad generosa que da de nuestro tiempo, talento y tesoro. Nuestros ministros de música hacen un trabajo magnífico al ofrecernos música litúrgica que eleva nuestras almas a lo divino. Pero solo falta una cosa. Necesitamos unirnos a ellos mientras cantan. Muchas veces parece que los percibimos como meros artistas que nos gusta escuchar en lugar de ministros litúrgicos que dedican gran parte de su tiempo a ensayar para guiarnos a todos en la canción.

El Catecismo de la Iglesia Católica enumera tres criterios principales para que la música cumpla su propósito litúrgico en la Misa: "la belleza expresiva de la oración, la participación unánime de la asamblea en los momentos designados y el carácter solemne de la celebración (1157)". Quiero enfocarme en el segundo criterio, que es la participación unánime de la asamblea. Sí, sé que no todos estamos dotados de voces angelicales, pero todavía estamos llamados a cantar. Recuerdo cuando era niño a mi padre, que definitivamente no fue bendecido con una gran voz para cantar (lo siento, papá), cantando a todo lo alto durante la misa como un ejemplo para el resto de su familia. Hicimos lo mismo.

Hay un gran artículo en línea en aleteia.org de un compositor católico JP Mauro sobre cantar en la Misa que dice: "Estamos llamados como católicos a dar testimonio de Cristo, a participar en la Misa y a estar en comunión unos con otros. Cantar en unísono con nuestra comunidad fomenta la unidad y nos acerca a Dios".

También aborda la pregunta de ¿qué pasa si no puedo cantar? "Ya sea que tengan una voz que esté destinada a concursos de canto televisados o no, su voz fue colocada en este mundo por el Creador. Por extraño que sea decirlo, en este caso, sus opiniones sobre su destreza vocal son irrelevantes. Cantar en la Misa no es una cuestión de orgullo, sino una oportunidad de ponernos al descubierto ante Cristo. Una vez que esto se entiende, en realidad quita mucha la presión. Ahora podemos ser como los santos tontos que deliberadamente se burlaron de las convenciones de la sociedad para servir a un propósito religioso".

¿Y qué pasa si no les gusta cantar? Bueno, él también habla de eso: "A algunas personas simplemente no les gusta cantar. No hay nada de malo en esto, pero el Catecismo todavía nos instruye a cantar en "plena participación". En lugar de lamentar el destino de uno, es sabio reconocer que esta es su cruz para llevar. Esta es una oportunidad para que tomen un momento incómodo y, como su abuela les haya enseñado, "Ofrécelo a Dios".

Nuestros ministros de música quieren que se unan a ellos. Sí, estoy consciente de que algunas de las canciones, especialmente en la misa de las 10:30 a.m., pueden estar un poco fuera de nuestro alcance, pero comencemos con algo simple: las partes de la misa. Nuestro ministerio de música en todas las Misas ha estado cantando las mismas melodías de la Misa (Gloria, Aleluya, Santo, etc.) durante casi tres años. Ya deberíamos conocerlos. Canten esas partes de la Misa ya que son una parte integral de nuestra oración litúrgica. Como celebrante, a veces nos desanimamos cuando le decimos a la comunidad que alce sus corazones y se una al coro de ángeles y simplemente recibimos miradas en blanco mientras el coro está cantando.

Así que no tengan miedo. No se avergüencen. En este domingo de Pentecostés, el Espíritu Santo, que siempre nos llama a cambiar, nos llama a alzar nuestras voces unánimemente para cantar las alabanzas de nuestro magnífico Dios que en este día nos dio el Espíritu. Recordemos la gran cita de San Agustín: "¡El que canta, reza dos veces!"

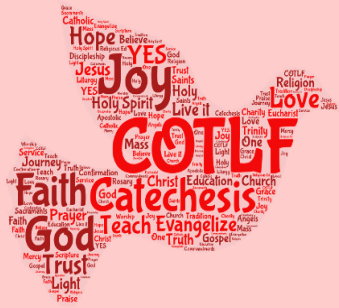

2023-2024 classes will be held on **Wednesdays only**, from September 13th, 2023 through May 10th, 2024.

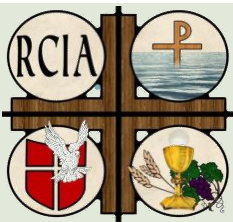




