# WEEKTY BULLETIN COLUMN

## Taken from Pope Francis' Angelus address on the 14th Sunday of Ordinary Time, July 9, 2017

In today's Gospel, Jesus says: "Come to me, all who labour and are heavy laden, and I will give you rest" (Mt 11:28). The Lord does not reserve this phrase for certain friends of his, no; he addresses it to "all" those who are weary and overwhelmed by life. And who could feel excluded from this invitation? The Lord knows how arduous life can be. He knows that many things weary the heart: disappointments and wounds of the past, burdens to carry and wrongs to bear in the present, uncertainties and worries about the future.

In the face of all this, Jesus' first word is an invitation, a call to move and respond: "Come". The mistake, when things go wrong, is to stay where we are, lying there. It seems obvious, but how difficult it is to respond and open ourselves! It is not easy. In dark times it feels natural to keep to ourselves, to ruminate over how unfair life is, over how ungrateful others are, how mean the world is, and so on. We all know it. We have had this awful experience a few times. But in this way, locked up inside ourselves, we see everything as grim. Then we even grow accustomed to sadness, which becomes like home: that sadness overcomes us: this sadness is a terrible thing. Jesus, however, wants to pull us out of this "quicksand" and thus says to each one: "Come! - Who? - You, you, you". The way out is in connecting, in extending a hand and lifting our gaze to those who truly love us.

In fact it is not enough to come out of ourselves; it is important to know where to go. Because many aims are illusory: they promise comfort and distract just a little; they guarantee peace and offer amusement, then leave us with the loneliness there was before; they are "fireworks". Therefore Jesus indicates where to go: "Come to me". And many times, in the face of a burden of life or a situation that saddens us, we try to talk about it with someone who listens to us, with a friend, with an expert.... This is a great thing to do, but let us not

forget Jesus. Let us not forget to open ourselves to him and to recount our life to him, to entrust people and situations to him. Perhaps there are "areas" of our life that we have never opened up to him and which have remained dark, because they have never seen the Lord's light. Each of us has our own story. And if someone has this dark area, seek out Jesus; go to a missionary of mercy; go to a priest; go.... But go to Jesus, and tell Jesus about this. Today he says to each one: "Take courage; do not give in to life's burdens; do not close yourself off in the face of fears and sins. Come to me!".

He awaits us; he always awaits us. Not to magically resolve problems, but to strengthen us amid our problems. Jesus does not lift the burdens from our life, but the anguish from our heart; he does not take away our cross, but carries it with us. And with him every burden becomes light (cf. v. 30), because he is the comfort we seek.

When Jesus enters life, peace arrives, the kind that remains even in trials, in suffering. Let us go to Jesus; let us give him our time; let us encounter him each day in prayer, in a trusting and personal dialogue; let us become familiar with his Word; let us fearlessly rediscover his forgiveness; let us eat of his Bread of Life: we will feel loved; we will feel comforted by him.

It is he himself who asks it of us, almost insists on it. He repeats it again at the end of today's Gospel: "learn from me, and you will find rest for your life" (cf. v. 29). And thus, let us learn to go to Jesus and, in the summer months, as we seek a little rest from what wearies the body, let us not forget to find true comfort in the Lord. May the Virgin Mary our Mother, who always takes care of us when we are weary and overwhelmed, help us and accompany us to Jesus.



## COLUMNA SEMANAL DEL BOLETIN

## Del Angelus del Santo Padre Francisco del 14 Domingo del Tiempo Ordinario, 9 de julio, 2017

En el Evangelio de hoy Jesús dice: «Venid a mí todos los que estáis fatigados y sobrecargados, y yo os daré descanso» (Mateo 11, 28). El Señor no reserva esta frase para alguien, sino que la dirige a "todos" los que están cansados y oprimidos por la vida. ¿Y quién puede sentirse excluido en esta invitación? Jesús sabe cuánto puede pesar la vida. Sabe que muchas cosas cansan al corazón: desilusiones y heridas del pasado, pesos que hay que cargar e injusticias que hay que soportar en el presente, incertidumbres y preocupaciones por el futuro.

Ante todo esto, la primera palabra de Jesús es una invitación a moverse y reaccionar: "venid". El error, cuando las cosas van mal, es permanecer donde se está, tumbado ahí. Parece evidente, pero iqué difícil es reaccionar y abrirse! No es fácil. En los momentos oscuros surge de manera natural estar con uno mismo, pensar en cuánto sea injusta la vida, en cuánto son ingratos los demás y qué malo es el mundo y demás. Algunas veces hemos padecido esta fea experiencia. Pero así, cerrados dentro de nosotros, vemos todo negro. Entonces incluso llega a familiarizarse con la tristeza, que se hace de casa: esa tristeza que nos postra, es una cosa fea esta tristeza. Jesús en cambio quiere sacarnos fuera de estas "arenas movedizas" y por eso dice a cada uno: "¡ven!" -"¿Quién?"-"tú, tú, tú...". La vía de salida está en la relación, en tender la mano y en levantar la mirada hacia quien nos ama de verdad.

Efectivamente salir solo no basta, es necesario saber dónde ir. Porque muchas metas son ilusorias: prometen descanso y distraen solo un poco, aseguran paz y dan diversión, dejando luego en la soledad de antes, son "fuegos artificiales". Por eso Jesús indica dónde ir: "venid a mí". Muchas veces, ante un peso de la vida o una situación que nos duele, intentamos hablar con alguien que nos escuche, con un amigo, con un experto... Es un gran

bien hacer esto, ¡pero no olvidemos a Jesús! No nos olvidemos de abrirnos a Él y contarle la vida, encomendarle personas y situaciones. Quizás hay "zonas" de nuestra vida que nunca le hemos abierto a Él y que han permanecido oscuras, porque no han visto nunca la luz del Señor. Cada uno de nosotros tiene la propia historia. Y si alguien tiene esta zona oscura, buscad a Jesús, id a un misionero de la misericordia, id a un sacerdote, id... Pero id a Jesús, y contadle esto a Jesús. Hoy Él dice a cada uno: "¡Ánimo, no te rindas ante los pesos de la vida, no te cierres ante los miedos y los pecados, sino ven a mí!".

Él nos espera, nos espera siempre, no para resolvernos mágicamente los problemas, sino para hacernos fuertes en nuestros problemas. Jesús no nos quita los pesos de la vida, sino la angustia del corazón; no nos quita la cruz, sino que la lleva con nosotros. Y con Él cada peso se hace ligero (cf. v. 30) porque Él es el descanso que buscamos.

Cuando en la vida entra Jesús, llega la paz, la que permanece en las pruebas, en los sufrimientos. Vayamos a Jesús, démosle nuestro tiempo, encontrémosle cada día en la oración, en un diálogo confiado y personal; familiaricemos con su Palabra, redescubramos sin miedo su perdón, saciémonos con su Pan de vida: nos sentiremos amados y consolados por Él.

Es Él mismo quien lo pide, casi insistiendo. Lo repite una vez más al final del Evangelio de hoy: «Aprended de mí [...] y hallaréis descanso para vuestras almas» (v. 29). Aprendamos a ir hacia Jesús y, mientras que en los meses estivales buscamos un poco de descanso de lo que cansa al cuerpo, no olvidemos encontrar el verdadero descanso en el Señor. Nos ayude en esto la Virgen María nuestra Madre, que siempre cuida de nosotros cuando estamos cansados y oprimidos y nos acompaña a Jesús.




## 2ND COLLECTION THIS WEEKEND: BLACK & INDIAN MISSIONS


