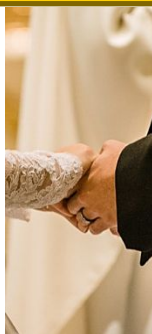

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

My Dear Friends:

It's been over a month since I wrote to you in this space. It is providential that I write to you again on this 16th of July which is traditionally the Feast of Our Lady of Mount Carmel who is the Marian patroness of our parish. This is the statue which beautifully graces the left side altar of our church where every morning people gather to pray the rosary before or after Mass. This is the image of Our Blessed Mother that our patroness St. Therese would pray to, not only in her convent, but when she was a child in her family's parish church. I was able to see that statue of Our Lady of Mount Carmel that Therese prayed to last month when I visited Lisieux.

On July 16, 1894, Therese wrote a poem of gratitude to Our Lady of Mount Carmel. The third stanza says:

*Close to you, O my loving Mother!
I've found rest for my heart;
I want nothing more on earth.
Jesus alone is all my happiness.
If sometimes I feel sadness
And fear coming to assail me,
Always, supporting me in my weakness,
Mother, you deign to bless me.*

For those who may not be familiar with the story of Our Lady of Mount Carmel and the tradition of the scapular, here is a good summary from Catholic News Agency:

The feast of Our Lady of Mount Carmel, celebrated on July 16, was first instituted in the late 14th century in commemoration of the approval of the rule of the Carmelite Order a hundred years earlier. According to legend, a religious community was established even before the time of Christ on Mount Carmel. This is the mountain overlooking the Mediterranean Sea on which the prophet Elijah successfully challenged the priests of Baal and won the people to the true God. The feast of Our Lady of Mount Carmel entered the Calendar of the universal Church in the early 18th century...

The brown Scapular of Our Lady of Mount Carmel, according to the Carmelite tradition, was presented by Our Lady to St. Simon Stock, the then Father General on July 16, 1251. Our Lady gave St. Simon a scapular for the Carmelites with the following promise, saying: "Receive, My beloved son, this habit of thy order: this shall be to thee and to all Carmelites a privilege, that

whosoever dies clothed in this shall never suffer eternal fire It shall be a sign of salvation, a protection in danger, and a pledge of peace."

The scapular stands for:

- *A commitment to follow Jesus, like Mary, the perfect model of all the disciples of Christ. This commitment finds its origin in baptism.*
- *It leads into the community of Carmel, a community of religious men and women, which has existed in the Church for over eight centuries.*
- *It reminds of the example of the saints of Carmel, with whom it establishes a close bond as brothers and sisters.*
- *It is an expression of the belief that the bearers of the scapular will meet God in eternal life, aided by the intercession and prayers of Mary.*

The Carmelites insist that the scapular is not:

- *A magical charm to protect someone.*
- *An automatic guarantee of salvation.*
- *An excuse for not living up to the demands of the Christian life*

It is instead a sign which has been approved by the Church for over seven centuries and which stands for the decision to

- *Follow Jesus like Mary:*
 - *Be open to God and to his will.*
 - *Be guided by faith, hope, and love.*
 - *To pray at all times*
 - *To discover God present in all that happens around us.*
- (CNA Resources)*

Like our patroness, let us turn today to Our Lady of Mount Carmel, that she may always intercede for and protect our parish family.

DEL ESCRITORIO DEL PARROCO

Mis Queridos Amigos:

Ha pasado más de un mes desde que les escribo. Es providencial que yo escriba de nuevo en este 16 de julio, que es tradicionalmente la fiesta de Nuestra Señora del Carmen, que es la patrona mariana de nuestra parroquia. Esta es la estatua que adorna bellamente el altar lateral izquierdo de nuestra iglesia, donde cada mañana los feligreses se reúnen para rezar el rosario antes o después de la misa. Esta es la imagen de Nuestra Santísima Madre a la que nuestra patrona Santa Teresita rezaba, no solo en su convento, sino cuando era niña en la iglesia parroquial de su familia. El mes pasado, cuando visité a Lisieux, pude ver la estatua de Nuestra Señora del Monte Carmelo, a la que Teresa rezaba.

El 16 de julio de 1894, Teresa escribió un poema de gratitud a Nuestra Señora del Monte Carmelo. La tercera estrofa dice:

*¡Cerca de ti, oh, Madre mi amorosa!
He encontrado descanso para mi corazón;
No quiero nada más en la tierra.
Sólo Jesús es toda mi felicidad.
Si a veces siento tristeza
y miedo viene a asaltarme,
siempre, apoyándome en mi debilidad,
Madre, te dignas bendecirme.*

Para aquellos que no estén familiarizados con la historia de Nuestra Señora del Monte Carmelo y la tradición del escapulario, aquí hay un buen resumen de la Agencia Católica de Noticias:

La fiesta de Nuestra Señora del Monte Carmelo, celebrada el 16 de julio, se instituyó por primera vez a finales del siglo XIV en conmemoración de la aprobación de la regla de la Orden Carmelita cien años antes. Según la leyenda, una comunidad religiosa se estableció incluso antes de la época de Cristo en el Monte Carmelo. Esta es la montaña con vistas al mar Mediterráneo en la que el profeta Elías desafió con éxito a los sacerdotes de Baal y ganó a la gente para el Dios verdadero. La fiesta de Nuestra Señora del Monte Carmelo entró en el calendario de la Iglesia universal a principios del siglo 18.

El Escapulario marrón de Nuestra Señora del Monte Carmelo, según la tradición carmelita, fue presentado

por Nuestra Señora a San Simón Stock, el entonces Padre General el 16 de julio de 1251. Nuestra Señora le dio a San Simón un escapulario para las carmelitas con la siguiente promesa, diciendo: "Recibe, mi amado hijo, este hábito de tu orden: esto será para ti y para todos las carmelitas un privilegio, que cualquiera que muera vestido de esto nunca sufra fuego eterno ... Será un signo de salvación, una protección en peligro y una prenda de paz".

El escapulario significa:

- *Un compromiso de seguir a Jesús, como María, el modelo perfecto de todos los discípulos de Cristo. Este compromiso encuentra su origen en el bautismo.*
- *Conduce a la comunidad del Carmelo, una comunidad de religiosos y religiosas, que existe en la Iglesia desde hace más de ocho siglos.*
- *Recuerda el ejemplo de los santos del Carmelo, con quienes establece un estrecho vínculo como hermanos y hermanas.*
- *Es una expresión de la creencia de que los portadores del escapulario encontrarán a Dios en la vida eterna, ayudados por la intercesión y las oraciones de María.*

Los carmelitas insisten en que el escapulario no es:

- *Un amuleto mágico para proteger a alguien.*
- *Una garantía automática de salvación.*
- *Una excusa para no estar a la altura de las exigencias de la vida cristiana*

En cambio, es un signo que ha sido aprobado por la Iglesia durante más de siete siglos y que representa la decisión de

- *Sigue a Jesús como María:*
- *Ábrete a Dios y a su voluntad.*
- *Ser guiado por la fe, la esperanza y el amor.*
- *Orar en todo momento*
- *Descubrir a Dios presente en todo lo que sucede a nuestro alrededor. (Recursos CNA)*

Como nuestra patrona, dirijámonos hoy a Nuestra Señora del Carmen, para que siempre interceda y proteja a nuestra familia parroquial.

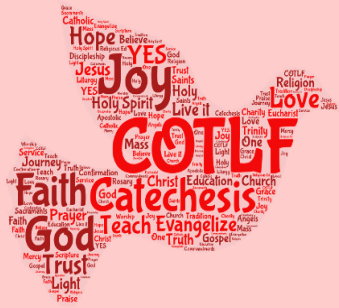

2023-2024 classes will be held on **Wednesdays only**, from September 13th, 2023 through May 10th, 2024.

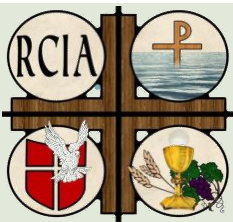

WORLD DAY FOR GRANDPARENTS PLENARY INDULGENCE

Catholics who celebrate the World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly July 23 can receive a plenary indulgence, which is a remission of the temporal punishment due for one's sins. A plenary indulgence will be extended "to grandparents, the elderly and all the faithful who, motivated by the true spirit of penitence and charity," attend Mass or other services to celebrate the world day and that the indulgence can "also be applied as suffrage for the souls in purgatory." It will also apply to "the faithful who dedicate adequate time to visit in person or virtually, through means of communication, elderly brothers and sisters in need or in difficulty" such as the sick, abandoned and disabled on July 23. The indulgence also is available to the elderly who are ill and "unable to leave their homes for serious reasons" but who nonetheless "will unite spiritually with the sacred services of the world day, offering to the merciful God their prayers, pains and sufferings of their lives," granted they satisfy the requirements for the indulgence.

*To receive a plenary indulgence, a person must show detachment from sin,
go to confession, receive the Eucharist and pray for the intentions of the pope.*



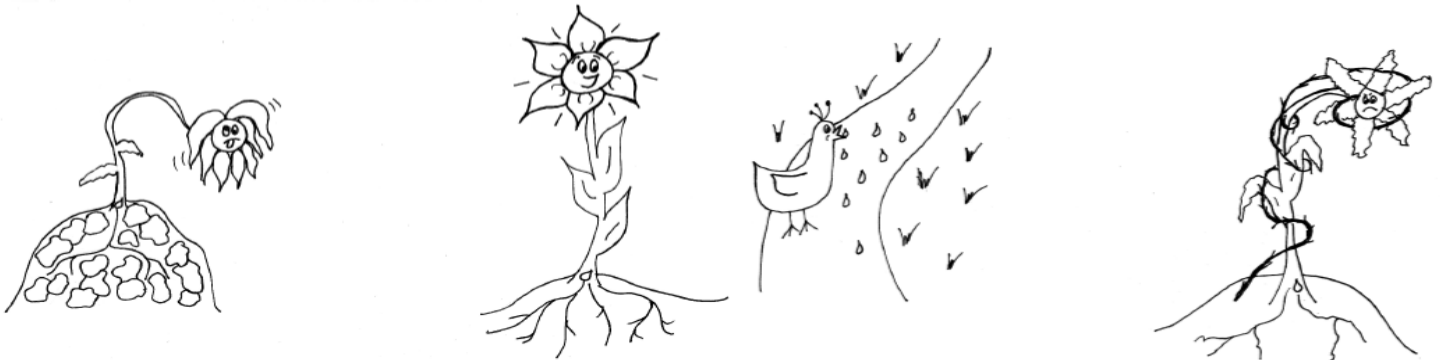
