# FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

#### My Dear Friends:

This past Friday we celebrated the Feast of the Nativity of the Blessed Virgin Mary which also coincides with the celebration of Our Lady of Charity, who is the co-patroness of the Archdiocese of Miami and patroness of Cuba. Last weekend, our parish was blessed in such a magnificent way when the statue of Our Lady of Charity that resides over the altar in her Shrine ("Ermita") that sits on Biscayne Bay visited our church. The statue rarely leaves the Shrine. Only on her feast day when Mass is being celebrated at a big arena or auditorium, or as was the case last week, when they take her on a pilgrimage outside the Shrine. Our Lady made 13 stops on a tour around Dade County through landmarks and churches. We were indeed blessed when the rector of the Shrine called to ask me if Little Flower could be one of the stops.

Our Carmelite Sisters, our priests, and an enthusiastic group of parishioners waited inside the air-conditioned confines of our church to escape the heat, and almost without warning, the sound of police sirens and honking cars led us out of the church as we saw the beautiful sight of a caravan leading Our Lady down Sevilla and Anastasia Avenue coming from Red Road. The pickup truck that carried her parked directly in front of our church where our brides arrive for their weddings. There was palpable joy in the air as we gazed upon the glorious face of our Blessed Mother. Our Carmelite Sisters serenaded her, we prayed a decade of the rosary, and the rector of the Shrine said a prayer of blessing over our parish, so that Mary may protect all of us with her mantle. We took pictures, prayed for Cuba, sang some more, and before we knew it, she departed to her next stop.

It was indeed an emotional visit. Lots of teary eyes were seen because of what Our Lady of Charity means to so many of our Cuban parishioners and because of what our Blessed Mother means to all of us. St. Thérèse once said: "Do not be afraid of loving the Blessed Virgin too

much. You can never love her enough. And Jesus will be very happy, because the Blessed Virgin is His Mother." That evening of her visit as I prayed over this historic pilgrimage to our church, I could not help but think of the words of St. Elizabeth when Mary visited her, "And how does this happen to me, that the mother of my Lord should come to me? (Luke 1:43)" Since I was a child, my family would visit Our Lady at her seaside Shrine, but to have her here on our grounds in front of our majestic church, it made so many of us cry. The rector reminded us that upon receiving the Word made flesh in her womb, Mary went in haste to visit her cousin Elizabeth, and now she was visiting us to bring us the joy of her Son, to bring us his peace. How blessed are we as a parish that our Blessed Mother came to visit us?

And the last words the rector imparted to us? The words of Mary herself telling us over and over again: "Do whatever He tells you (John 2:5)." She is always pointing us to her Son, pointing us to His Presence in the Blessed Sacrament, and pointing us towards the Mass where we encounter the living Christ. Mary is the Woman of the Eucharist par excellence, and she came to us during this National Eucharistic Revival to renew our love for Jesus who waits for us at the altar. May we always give thanks to Mary for her yes and give thanks to her Son who on the cross gave us so noble a mother and queen! Our Lady of Charity, pray for us!

### DEL ESCRITORIO DEL PARROCO

#### Mis Queridos Amigos:

El viernes pasado celebramos la Fiesta de la Natividad de la Santísima Virgen María que también coincide con la celebración de Nuestra Señora de la Caridad, que es la copatrona de la Arquidiócesis de Miami y patrona de Cuba. El fin de semana pasado, nuestra parroquia fue bendecida de una manera tan magnífica cuando la estatua de Nuestra Señora de la Caridad que reside sobre el altar en su Santuario ("Ermita") que se encuentra en la Bahía de Biscayne visitó nuestra iglesia. La estatua rara vez sale del Santuario. Solo el día de su fiesta, cuando se celebra la misa en una gran arena o auditorio, o como fue el caso la semana pasada, cuando la llevan en peregrinación fuera del Santuario. Nuestra Señora hizo 13 paradas en un recorrido por el condado de Dade a través de monumentos e iglesias. De hecho, fuimos bendecidos cuando el rector del Santuario me llamó para preguntarme si Little Flower podría ser una de las paradas.

carmelitas, Nuestras hermanas nuestros sacerdotes y un entusiasta grupo de feligreses esperaron dentro de los confines con aire acondicionado de nuestra iglesia para escapar del calor, y casi sin previo aviso, el sonido de las sirenas de la policía y los autos que tocaban la bocina nos sacaron de la iglesia cuando vimos la hermosa vista de una caravana que conducía a Nuestra Señora por Sevilla y la avenida Anastasia que venía de Red Road. La camioneta que la transportaba estacionada directamente frente a nuestra iglesia donde llegan nuestras novias para sus bodas. Había una alegría palpable en el aire mientras contemplábamos el rostro glorioso de nuestra Santísima Madre. Nuestras hermanas carmelitas le dieron una serenata, rezamos una década del rosario, y el rector del Santuario dijo de oración de bendición sobre nuestra parroquia para que María pueda protegernos a todos con su manto. Tomamos fotos, oramos por Cuba, cantamos un poco más, y antes de que nos diéramos cuenta, ella partió a su siguiente parada.

De hecho, fue una visita emotiva. Se vieron muchos ojos llorosos por lo que Nuestra Señora de la Caridad significa para muchos de nuestros feligreses

cubanos y por lo que nuestra Santísima Madre significa para todos nosotros. Santa Teresa dijo una vez: "No tengáis miedo de amar demasiado a la Santísima Virgen. Nunca puedes amarla lo suficiente. Y Jesús será muy feliz, porque la Santísima Virgen es su Madre". Esa noche de su visita, mientras oraba por esta peregrinación histórica a nuestra iglesia, no pude evitar pensar en las palabras de Santa Isabel cuando María la visitó: "¿Y cómo me sucede esto, que la madre de mi Señor venga a mí? (Lucas 1:43)" Desde que era niño, mi familia visitaba a Nuestra Señora en su santuario junto al mar, pero tenerla aquí en nuestros terrenos frente a nuestra majestuosa iglesia, hizo llorar a muchos. El rector nos recordó que al recibir el Verbo hecho carne en su seno. María fue apresuradamente a visitar a su prima Isabel, y ahora nos visitaba para traernos la alegría de su Hijo, para traernos su paz. ¿Qué tan bendecidos somos como parroquia que nuestra Santísima Madre haya venido a visitarnos?

¿Y las últimas palabras que nos dio el rector? Las palabras de María misma diciéndonos una y otra vez: "Haced lo que Él os diga (Juan 2:5)". Ella siempre nos señala a su Hijo, nos señala su presencia en el Santísimo Sacramento y nos señala hacia la Misa donde encontramos al Cristo vivo. María es la Mujer de la Eucaristía por excelencia, y vino a nosotros durante este Avivamiento Eucarístico Nacional para renovar nuestro amor por Jesús que nos espera en el altar. ¡Que demos siempre gracias a María por su sí, y demos gracias a su Hijo que en la cruz nos dio una madre y una reina tan noble! ¡Nuestra Señora de la Caridad, ruega por nosotros!



### HOMELESS MINISTRY COLLECTION DRIVE

During the month of September we will be collecting the following items that will be delivered directly to the Missionaries of Charity shelter in Miami's inner city:

-Category 1, Food: Canned & Dry Non-Perishable Foods (ideally large canned items from Gordon Food Service that could be used to stock up the Missionaries of Charity's kitchen pantry. They feed hundreds of homeless a day through their kitchen located in the shelter). Desired donations include large cans of tomato sauces, pastas, rice bags, green beans, corn and other canned vegetables.

Also they can use iced tea powder, small sugar packets and instant coffee. We will also like to collect sliced bread, peanut butter and jelly for sandwiches as well as cases of bottled water.

-Category 2, Women's Hygiene & Toiletry Items: women's deodorant, soap bars, shampoo, shaving cream, cleansing wipes, disposable razors, body lotions, combs/hair brushes, toothpaste and toothbrushes. (Please make sure they are not travel sized items)

-Category 3, Cleaning Supplies: kitchen dish soap, degreaser, clorox/bleach, disinfectant spray and hand sanitizer.

All items can be dropped off ONLY during the following weekend masses at the Homeless Ministry Collection Area inside the church:

### September 11th Ground Zero Prayer

It has been 22 years since the tragic events of September 11, 2001, but the wounds of that morning still feel new as we contemplate the loss of life that occurred that day. May we always remember the souls lost and all the men and women in uniform who gave their lives since then to protect our country. Here below is the prayer Pope Benedict XVI prayed when he visited Ground Zero in New York in April 2008:

O God of love, compassion, and healing, look on us, people of many different faiths and traditions. who gather today at this site, the scene of incredible violence and pain. We ask you in your goodness to give eternal light and peace to all who died here-the heroic first-responders: our fire fighters, police officers, emergency service workers, and Port Authority personnel, along with all the innocent men and women who were victims of this tradedy simply because their work or service brought them here on September 11, 2001. We ask you, in your compassion to bring healing to those who, because of their presence here that day, suffer from injuries and illness. Heal, too, the pain of still-grieving families and all who lost loved ones in this tragedy. Give them strength to continue their lives with courage and hope.



We are mindful as well of those who suffered death, injury, and loss on the same day at the Pentagon and in Shanksville, Pennsylvania. Our hearts are one with theirs as our prayer embraces their pain and suffering. God of peace, bring your peace to our violent world: peace in the hearts of all men and women and peace among the nations of the earth. Turn to your way of love those whose hearts and minds are consumed with hatred. God of understanding, overwhelmed by the magnitude of this tragedy, we seek your light and guidance as we confront such terrible events. Grant that those whose lives were spared may live so that the lives lost here may not have been lost in vain. Comfort and console us, strengthen us in hope, and give us the wisdom and courage to work tirelessly for a world where true peace and love reign among nations and in the hearts of all.



# The Road to 100!

Earlier this fall, St. Theresa School opened its doors for the 98th time since September of 1925. In 1926, Church of the Little Flower was officially established as the newest parish of the then-Diocese of St. Augustine. As we prepare to soon celebrate the Centennial of our beloved parish church and school, it's important to first honor our past, recognizing the firm foundation upon which we stand today. The legacy of our founding parishioners is one we are deeply proud of and as a new year of ministry and service now gets underway, let's take a look back to how it all began!

1925: St. Joseph's Academy, which will later become St. Theresa Catholic School, is founded by the Sisters of St. Joseph of St. Augustine, FL.

## 1926-1927: Church of the Little Flower parish is established and a temporary church is built and dedicated.

But that's not our church! Pictured at left is an excerpt from the December 7, 1927 issue of Miami Daily News and Metropolis, showing Comber Hall as it appeared when it was erected. First built as a temporary church in 1926, Comber Hall was actually our parish's primary place of worship for 25 years, until the proper church which we enjoy today was built in 1951, following the original plans and design laid out by Msgr. Comber.

#### Fun Facts:

- St. Joseph Academy was built at a total cost of \$150,000 and construction was completed in the fall of 1925.
- St. Joseph Academy first opened its doors on Sept 15, 1925.
- St. Joseph Academy jointly graduated its first class of 8th graders and high school seniors in May,1926.
- At Msgr. Comber's arrival to COTLF in October 1926, the parish consisted of 220 Catholic men and women.
- Comber Hall was built at a total cost of \$75,000 and was completed in 7 months, from June to December, 1927.
- COTLF's first Confirmation was celebrated at the church's formal dedication, presided by Bishop Barry in Jan, 1928.
- St. Joseph Academy was renamed St. Theresa School in 1932, when it become the parochial school of COTLF.
