

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

My Dear Friends,

Silence. That sound is so rare. Many of us avoid silence. I know there have been times in my life that evitamos el silencio. Sé que ha habido momentos en mi I have avoided it, but yet the most blessed times I have had in my spiritual life are when I have embraced it. Only in silence can we listen to the voice of God. Only in silence can we listen to one another in a culture where we constantly try to yell over the other. On this First Sunday of Lent, we journey with Jesus into the desert where the gospel tells us that he had no food and was tempted by the devil. Another thing Jesus encountered in the desert was silence. There was no better way to prepare for his bout with the devil and for his public ministry than to be embraced by the silence that allows the voice of the Father to be crystal clear.

So why are we afraid of silence? Why do feel the need to constantly fill our lives with noise? My father and I when we go fishing have sometimes gone through long periods of time without talking while our lines are in the water. The only sound is the waves and the breeze. It's not that we have nothing to talk about. Quite the contrary. Silence at times speaks volumes and I'm not talking about passive aggressive silent treatment. I'm talking about the silence that communicates so much love. Just look at St. Joseph who said nothing in the Bible. Look at the brief words of Mary who through her silence taught her son so much. We need to make room in our lives for silence.

This is our challenge this Lent. As we journey with Jesus into the desert, we must make room for silence in our lives. Sit in the church in the afternoon when it is empty. Go for a walk or a jog without your headphones and without music and just listen to the wind. En este primer domingo de Cuaresma, viajamos con Jesús al desierto, donde el Evangelio nos dice que no tenía comida y fue tentado por el diablo. Otra cosa que Jesús encontró en el desierto fue el silencio. No había mejor manera de prepararse para su lucha con el diablo y para su ministerio público que estar envuelto por el silencio que permite que la voz del Padre sea cristalina.

Entonces, ¿por qué tenemos miedo del silencio? ¿Por qué sentimos la necesidad de llenar constantemente nuestras vidas de ruido? Se nos dice que las amistades son fomentadas por una buena comunicación, pero he hablaba. En el silencio de sus acciones es cómo comunicó sus mayores lecciones. Mi padre y yo cuando vamos a pescar a veces hemos pasado por largos períodos de tiempo sin hablar mientras nuestras varas están en el agua. El único sonido son las olas y la brisa. No es que no tengamos nada de qué hablar. Todo lo contrario. El silencio a veces habla mucho y no estoy hablando del tratamiento silencioso agresivo pasivo. Hablo del silencio que comunica tanto amor. Sólo miren a San José que no dijo nada en la Biblia. Miren las palabras breves de María que a través de su silencio le enseñó tanto a su hijo. Tenemos que hacer espacio en nuestras vidas para el silencio.

Este es nuestro reto esta Cuaresma. Al viajar con Jesús hacia el desierto, debemos hacer espacio para el silencio en nuestra vida. Siéntense en la iglesia por la tarde cuando está vacía. Vayan a dar un paseo o a trotar sin los auriculares y sin música y sólo escuchen la brisa.



WHAT EXACTLY IS SACRED MUSIC?

The Pillar, an exceptional Catholic News Service, recently posted a long-form article on Sacred Music. In light of our Centennial campaign and plans to install an authentic, mechanical-action pipe organ, we are sharing some key excerpts from the article below. The phrase "sacred music" has gained a lot of traction in Catholic conversations in recent years, with many liturgists and other Church leaders emphasizing the importance of "sacred music" in the Church's liturgies.

But to the average Catholic in the pew - even one who attends weekly Mass and takes his or her faith life seriously - the meaning of the phrase may not immediately be clear.

What makes music "sacred"? Must it be in Latin? Chanted? Accompanied by an organ? Can any music be sacred if it is intended for use in the liturgy?

And why does it matter what music gets played at Mass?

Sacred music is discussed by Pope Pius X in the 1903 motu proprio *Tra Le Sollecitudini*. The pope lays out three criteria for sacred music: sanctity, goodness of form, and universality.

Sacred music is discussed further in *Sacrosanc-tum concilium*, the Second Vatican Council's constitution on the liturgy, which devotes a full chapter to the subject.

The document describes sacred music as "a treasure of inestimable value" for the Church, and says its purpose is "the glory of God and the sanctification of the faithful."

"[S]acred music is to be considered the more holy in proportion as it is more closely connected with the liturgical action, whether it adds delight to prayer, fosters unity of minds, or confers greater solemnity upon the sacred rites," *Sacrosanctum concilium* states...

Gregorian chant is "specially suited to the Roman liturgy" and "should be given pride of place in liturgical services."

But the Vatican II text also says that "other kinds of sacred music, especially polyphony, are by no means excluded from liturgical celebrations, so long as they accord with the spirit of the liturgical action."

A few years after Vatican II, *Musicam sacram* was released as a post-conciliar document, designed to implement what *Sacrosanctum concilium* had taught about sacred music.

The document offers guidelines about the use of sacred music. It notes several general preferences, but it also allows for significant flexibility in the liturgical music that is chosen.

It says the pipe organ holds a special place in divine worship, but other instruments can also be used, provided that they "are suitable for sacred use, or can be adapted to it, that they are in keeping with the dignity of the temple, and truly contribute to the edification of the faithful."

While it says that "[a]bove all, the study and practice of Gregorian chant is to be promoted," it also allows for the creation of new works of sacred music, as long as they are fitting with the dignity of the Mass, and follow the general principles of the Church's established sacred music tradition.


