

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

My Dear Friends,

HAPPY EASTER! CHRIST IS RISEN!

This is the rallying cry of the Christian. This is the central mystery of our faith. St. Paul says it very clearly in his first letter to the Corinthians: "...if Christ has not been raised, then empty [too] is our preaching; empty, too, your faith (1 Cor 15:14)." We gather today to celebrate the greatest event in human history. St. Augustine said: "The resurrection of Christ is God's supreme and wholly marvelous work."

The liturgy itself acknowledges that we are overcome with paschal joy. Sin and death no longer have any power over us because of Christ's great victory, and he has made us sharers in this glorious victory. For forty days we have been going through the disciplines of Lent to die to ourselves so that we can rise to new life with Jesus. The tomb could not contain our Lord, and nothing on this earth can contain the joy that we feel on this day. For forty days, we have also kept hidden the song of an Easter people: Alleluia! Through the desert of Lent, we looked forward to this cry of Alleluia. St. John Paul II once famously said:

We do not pretend that life is all beauty. We are aware of darkness and sin, of poverty and pain. But we know Jesus has conquered sin and passed through his own pain to the glory of the Resurrection. And we live in the light of his Paschal Mystery - the mystery of his Death and Resurrection. "We are an Easter People and Alleluia is our song!". We are not looking for a shallow joy but rather a joy that comes from faith, that grows through unselfish love, that respects the "fundamental duty of love of neighbor, without which it would be unbecoming to speak of Joy". We realize that joy is demanding; it demands unselfishness; it demands a readiness to say with Mary: "Be it done unto me according to thy word". (11/30/86)

This joy that we experience today is not fleeting. It is the joy that Christ wishes to give us, and that he wants us to abide in. As St. John Paul II said, joy can be demanding because it requires unselfishness, a total giving of ourselves to the other. This is what the Risen Christ teaches us. There is joy in love of God and love of neighbor. Let us spend our Easter doing good and, like Mary, attentive to the will of our Heavenly Father.

Today we are also experiencing a communal joy as a parish for during the Easter Vigil we welcomed 10 new members to the Body of Christ. I had the honor of baptizing 10 catechumens who are now neophytes in our faith. The youngest is 13 years old and the oldest is 61. They hail from Cuba, Brazil, and one was born in Vladivostok, Russia. Those born in this country come from right here in Florida, and also from New Mexico and New Jersey. I ask you to please pray for them as they embrace the Catholic faith and are on fire and ready to proclaim the gospel of the Risen Christ to the world.

To those who are visiting us today for Easter Sunday, the Church of the Little Flower welcomes you. No matter where you come from, we pray that you feel at home in our church as you join us in celebrating the Resurrection. And to our parishioners, thank you for the prayers you offered for your priests during this past Holy Week. Yes, we are tired, but our hearts are filled with joy for all the numerous confessions we heard and the souls we brought back home to our Lord. On behalf of all the priests and deacons, our dear Carmelite Sisters, and the incredible staff and ministers of Little Flower, we wish all of you joyous and blessed Easter Sunday! "Jesus Christ is risen! He is risen indeed!"

DEL ESCRITORIO DEL PARROCO

Mis Queridos Amigos,

¡FELICES PASCUAS! ¡CRISTO HA RESUCITADO!

Este es el grito de guerra del cristiano. Este es el misterio central de nuestra fe. San Pablo lo dice muy claramente en su primera carta a los Corintios:

"...si Cristo no ha resucitado, vacía es también nuestra predicación; vacío es también vuestra fe (1 Co 15,14)". Nos reunimos hoy para celebrar el acontecimiento más grande de la historia de la humanidad. San Agustín dijo: "La resurrección de Cristo es la obra suprema y totalmente maravillosa de Dios".

La misma litúrgica reconoce que estamos abrumados por la alegría pascual. El pecado y la muerte ya no tienen ningún poder sobre nosotros debido a la gran victoria de Cristo, y él nos ha hecho partícipes de esta gloriosa victoria. Durante cuarenta días hemos estado pasando por las disciplinas de la Cuaresma para morir a nosotros mismos para que podamos resucitar a una nueva vida con Jesús. La tumba no podía contener a nuestro Señor, y nada en esta tierra puede contener el gozo que sentimos en este día. Durante cuarenta días, también hemos mantenido oculto el canto de un pueblo pascual: ¡Aleluya! A través del desierto de la Cuaresma, esperábamos este grito de Aleluya. San Juan Pablo II diio una vez:

No pretendemos afirmar que todo en la vida sea bueno y bello. Somos conscientes de la existencia de la oscuridad y del pecado, de la pobreza y del sufrimiento. Pero sabemos que Jesús ha vencido al pecado, pasando a través de su propio sufrimiento a la gloria de la Resurrección. Y nosotros vivimos a la luz de su Misterio Pascual: el misterio de su muerte y resurrección. "Somos un pueblo de Resurrección y el aleluya es nuestra canción". No buscamos una y el increíble personal y ministros de Little Flower, alegría superficial, sino una alegría que brota de la fe, que crece a través de la autodonación amorosa, que anima a la realización del "deber primordial de amar al prójimo, sin el cual sería poco oportuno hablar de alegría" (Pablo VI, Gaudete in Domino, I). Sabemos muy bien que la alegría es exigente, requiere generosidad; requiere disponibilidad absoluta para decir con María: "Hágase en mi según tu palabra" (Lucas 1, 38).

Esta alegría que experimentamos hoy no es breve. Es el gozo que Cristo desea darnos, y en el que guiere que permanezcamos. Como decía san Juan Pablo II, la alegría puede ser exigente porque requiere altruismo, una entrega total de nosotros mismos a los demás. Esto es lo que nos enseña Cristo resucitado. Hay gozo en el amor a Dios y en el amor al prójimo. Dediquemos nuestra Pascua haciendo el bien y, como María, atentos a la voluntad de nuestro Padre celestial.

Hoy también estamos experimentando una alegría comunitaria como parroquia, ya que durante la Vigilia Pascual dimos la bienvenida a 10 nuevos miembros al Cuerpo de Cristo. Tuve el honor de bautizar a 10 catecúmenos que ahora son neófitos en nuestra fe. El más joven tiene 13 años y el mayor 61. Provienen de Cuba, Brasil y uno nació en Vladivostok, Rusia. Los nacidos en este país vienen de aquí mismo en Florida, y también de Nuevo México y Nueva Jersey. Les pido que por favor oren por ellos mientras abrazan la fe católica y están encendidos y listos para proclamar el evangelio de Cristo Resucitado al mundo.

A los que nos visitan hoy por el Domingo de Pascua, la Iglesia de Little Flower les doy la bienvenida. No importa de dónde vengas, oramos para que te sientas como en casa en nuestra iglesia mientras te unes a nosotros en la celebración de la Resurrección. Y a nuestros feligreses, gracias por las oraciones que ofrecieron por sus sacerdotes durante la pasada Semana Santa. Sí, estamos cansados, pero nuestros corazones están llenos de alegría por todas las numerosas confesiones que escuchamos y las almas que trajimos de regreso a casa con nuestro Señor. En nombre de todos los sacerdotes y diáconos, nuestras queridas hermanas carmelitas iles deseamos a todos un feliz y bendecido Domingo de Pascua! "¡Jesucristo ha resucitado! ¡Ha resucitado verdaderamente!"

Centennial Project Updates

New Pews: In February, a sample pew with our selected wood, pew end design, and stain color was delivered and placed in the vestibule of the church. Though only one-seat wide, the sample was created to the exact scale of what the new pews will look and feel like. We have received the contract and are awaiting further fundraising progress to get that signed and locked in for installation prior to the Centennial Celebration in October 2026.

Church Organ: As of the printing of this bulletin, the final Organ contract is in the hands of the ADOM attorneys. We are on track to have the contract executed before Easter, guaranteeing a February 2026 delivery of the organ, so that it can be installed and voiced for the Centennial celebration in October 2026.

STS Multi-Purpose Center: Overall architectural design work continues while the project makes its way through the city's approval process. Updated renderings may be available before the end of the school year.





Registering as a Parishioner at Church of the Little Flower

Parishsoff® Connecting People and the Church

STEP 1 — REGISTER ON THE MAIN DATABASE

The COTLF Parish Database is called **ParishSoft Family Suite**. Once added as a member, you will be assigned a parishioner number (or envelope number). This number is used to track your offertory gifts, and by extension, your participation in Sunday Mass and the life of the parish. Though many people come to Little Flower regularly, we may have no record in the database if you have never formally registered as a parishioner!

Registering as a new parishioner or updating your family/contact information can be done online or right from your smart devices! Navigate to www.COTLF.org/register and follow the step by step instructions to create your login username and password. Once verified by the parish office, you will be assigned a parishioner number and granted full access to update your family record. You can then login any time to review or add family members, easily provide any updates to your contact information, find your envelope number, review your annual contribution history, and more.

If you are currently received church envelopes but have never created a login account, follow the same steps as a new user and the system will help us match that login to your existing database record. As always, you can also call or visit the parish office for any assistance with registering or updating your family or individual record.

STEP 2 — USE YOUR CHURCH ENVELOPES

Once you've been added to the database, you will be included in the bi-monthly mailing of offertory envelopes, which will be pre-printed with your name, address, and parishioner/envelope number. Be sure to bring these envelopes to Mass each weekend to place in the collection basket. Weekly donations made via your envelope



are tracked within the database for ease of providing parishioners with accurate end-of-year contribution acknowledgement letters. The use of envelopes also helps us generally track Mass attendance and participation.

While waiting for the next mailing of church envelopes, feel free to use a plain envelope with your parishioner number written clearly on the outside or add your parishioner number to the notes line if you write checks.

IMPORTANT NOTE TO OUR SCHOOL & REL.ED. FAMILIES:

The green children's envelopes provided to each student at the start of each school year are **not the same** as parishioner envelopes and there is no way of tracking those unless you manually write in your parishioner number. If you **only** have the green children's envelopes, please see Step 1 above to formally register!



OPTIONAL STEP 3 — SIGN UP FOR ONLINE GIVING

Parishioners have the option of signing up for OSV Online Giving, at www.osvhub.com/cotlf, in order to make automatic contributions via a credit/debit card or electronic funds transfer. Pledges or gifts to the Centennial Campaign may also be managed directly through this same system.

When signing up for Online Giving, you will not see anywhere to add an envelope number, but don't worry! After making your first donation, we will link your envelope number on the back end of the system and all future donations will be credited appropriately. Signing up for Online Giving is **not the same** as registering as a parishioner. Gifts made via OSV Online Giving that cannot be matched to an existing database entry will be credited to the **Anonymous Donor** entry. If you have not previously registered as a parishioner or are unsure whether you have a parishioner/envelope number, follow the instructions on Step 1 *first!*




