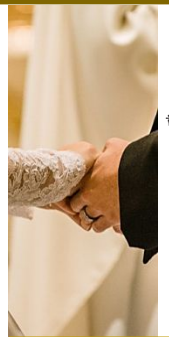

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

My Dear Friends,

We have come to the end of the Octave of Easter as we gather today to celebrate once again the Resurrection of our Lord! Holy Week and the Easter Triduum were observed with solemnity, great reverence, and joy here in our parish. From the never-ending lines for confessions on Holy Wednesday to the solemnity of the Mass of the Lord's Supper and the Washing of the Feet to the silent reverence we observed on Good Friday especially during the nighttime procession to the explosive joy that erupted during the Gloria at the Easter Vigil to finally the overflowing church on Easter Sunday: Holy Week at Little Flower never disappoints. There are so many people to thank who work behind the scenes to make the mysteries of those days come to life. Our music ministry continues to shine, and our altar decoration crew have outdone themselves again. Last week, we baptized 10 catechumens (today we baptize 7 more!), and I must thank all those who participate in forming these new Catholics who have been preparing since last September. Our altar servers, lectors, extraordinary ministers of Holy Communion, ushers, and MC all had plenty to do last week, and Father Andrew and I cannot thank all of them enough for their dedication to these sacred liturgies that mark the most important days on the Catholic calendar. To all of you, my dear parishioners, who were patient with the big crowds and all the visitors we received last Sunday, I thank you for embracing them with your hospitality. Let it be known that the Church of the Little Flower welcomes everyone in the name of the Risen Christ as we all seek to be transformed into his divine image. I ask you to please continue to pray for our newly baptized brothers and sisters who are just beginning to walk this glorious journey of faith that will, God willing, one day lead us to heaven to rejoice with our Lord and King.

Speaking of our newly baptized or neophytes, those who attended our Lenten Mission on the "Mass Explained" a few weeks ago had a little bit of liturgical trivia revealed to them. Today we celebrate the Second Sunday of Easter or Divine Mercy Sunday. But did you know that today is also called "Quasimodo Sunday?" Ok, you're probably thinking I'm making this up. Why would this Sunday within the Octave of Easter be named after a character of a Victor Hugo novel and a Disney movie, and what does it have to do with our neophytes who I referenced at the beginning of this paragraph? Let us turn to an explanation from Catholic News Agency:

Quasimodo is the Latin name for the Sunday following Easter. It is drawn from the first words of the entrance antiphon for the day, which is the chant sung as the priest approaches the altar for Mass. The entrance antiphon (also called the Introit) for Quasimodo Sunday begins with: "Like newborn infants," or, in Latin, "quasi modo geniti infantes."

The full chant, drawn from 1 Peter 2:2, is as follows: "As newborn babes, desire the rational milk without guile, that thereby you may grow unto salvation: If so be you have tasted that the Lord is sweet."

On this Sunday, also known as Low Sunday, Catholics are called to remember the newest members of the Church.

And why is "The Hunchback of Notre Dame" called Quasimodo in Victor Hugo's famous novel? The article referenced above explains that too:

In Hugo's novel, Quasimodo, rejected by his parents for his deformities, is abandoned inside Notre Dame Cathedral, at a place where orphans and unwanted children were dropped off.

Monseigneur Claude Frollo finds the child on "Quasimodo Sunday" and "called him Quasimodo; whether it was that he chose thereby to commemorate the day when he had found him, or that he meant to mark by that name how incomplete and imperfectly molded the poor little creature was," Hugo wrote.

During Lent, we all recognized that we were also incomplete and imperfect, but the Risen Christ sets out to make all things new and to mold us into his divine image. Our neophytes are now longing to be nourished like newborn infants from the graces that Christ offers through his Church. They long for these graces, we all do, as a newborn longs for his or her's mother's milk.

I pray we all continue to be transformed into Christ's image during this Easter season. May we learn from our neophytes who washed clean by the waters of baptism call us, like our patroness St. Therese, to be like children again: innocent and desiring God's choicest blessings.

DEL ESCRITORIO DEL PARROCO

Mis Queridos Amigos,

¡Hemos llegado al final de la Octava de Pascua mientras nos reunimos hoy para celebrar una vez más la Resurrección de nuestro Señor! La Semana Santa y el Triduo Pascual se celebraron con solemnidad, gran reverencia y alegría aquí en nuestra parroquia. Desde las interminables colas para confesarse el Miércoles Santo hasta la solemnidad de la Misa de la Cena del Señor y el Lavatorio de los Pies, pasando por la reverencia silenciosa que observamos el Viernes Santo, especialmente durante la procesión nocturna, hasta la alegría explosiva que estalló durante la Gloria en la Vigilia Pascual y, finalmente, la iglesia desbordada el Domingo de Pascua: La Semana Santa en Little Flower nunca defrauda. Hay tantas personas a las que agradecer que trabajan entre bastidores para hacer que los misterios de esos días cobren vida. Nuestro ministerio de música continúa brillando, y nuestro equipo de decoración de altares se ha superado a sí mismo nuevamente. La semana pasada bautizamos a 10 catecúmenos (¡hoy bautizamos a 7 más!), y debo agradecer a todos los que participan en la formación de estos nuevos católicos que se están preparando desde el pasado mes de septiembre. Nuestros monaguillos, lectores, ministros extraordinarios de la Sagrada Comunión, ujieres y maestros de ceremonias tuvieron mucho que hacer la semana pasada, y el Padre Andrew y yo no podemos agradecerles lo suficiente a todos ellos por su dedicación a estas sagradas liturgias que marcan los días más importantes del calendario católico. A todos ustedes, mis queridos feligreses, que tuvieron paciencia con las grandes multitudes y todos los visitantes que recibimos el domingo pasado, les agradezco que los hayan acogido con su hospitalidad. Que se sepa que la Iglesia de la Little Flower acoge a todos en el nombre de Cristo Resucitado, ya que todos buscamos ser transformados a su imagen divina. Les pido que por favor continúen orando por nuestros hermanos y hermanas recién bautizados que recién comienzan a caminar este glorioso camino de fe que, si Dios quiere, un día nos llevará al cielo para regocijarnos con nuestro Señor y Rey.

Hablando de nuestros recién bautizados o neófitos, a los que asistieron a nuestra Misión de Cuaresma en la "Misa Explicada" hace unas semanas se les reveló un poco de trivialidad litúrgica. Hoy celebramos el Segundo Domingo de Pascua o Domingo de la Divina Misericordia. Pero, ¿sabías que hoy también se llama "Domingo de Quasimodo"? Ok, probablemente estés pensando que me estoy inventando esto. ¿Por qué este domingo dentro de la Octava de Pascua lleva el nombre de un personaje de una novela de Víctor Hugo y de una película de Disney, y qué tiene que ver con nuestros neófitos a los que hice referencia al principio de este párrafo? Pasemos a una explicación de la Agencia Católica de Noticias:

Quasimodo es el nombre latino del domingo siguiente a la Pascua. Se extrae de las primeras palabras de la antifona de entrada del día, que es el canto que se canta cuando el sacerdote se acerca al altar para la misa. La antifona de entrada (también llamada Introito) para el Domingo de Quasimodo comienza con: "Como niños recién nacidos" o, en latín, "quasi modo geniti infantes".

El canto completo, extraído de 1 Pedro 2:2, es el siguiente: "Como niños recién nacidos, desead sin engaño la leche racional, para que en ella crezcáis para salvación; si es así, habéis gustado que el Señor es dulce".

En este domingo, también conocido como Domingo Bajo, los católicos están llamados a recordar a los miembros más nuevos de la Iglesia.

¿Y por qué "El jorobado de Notre Dame" se llama Quasimodo en la famosa novela de Víctor Hugo? El artículo al que se hace referencia anteriormente también lo explica:

En la novela de Hugo, Quasimodo, rechazado por sus padres por sus deformidades, es abandonado dentro de la catedral de Notre Dame, en un lugar donde se dejaba a los huérfanos y a los niños no deseados.

Monseñor Claude Frollo encuentra al niño el "domingo de Quasimodo" y "lo llamó Quasimodo; ya sea porque eligió conmemorar el día en que lo encontró, o porque quiso señalar con ese nombre lo incompleta e imperfectamente moldeada que estaba la pobre criatura", escribió Hugo.

Durante la Cuaresma, todos reconocimos que también éramos incompletos e imperfectos, pero Cristo resucitado se propone hacer nuevas todas las cosas y moldearnos a su imagen divina. Nuestros neófitos anhelan ahora ser alimentados como niños recién nacidos de las gracias que Cristo ofrece a través de su Iglesia. Ellos anhelan estas gracias, todos nosotros, como un recién nacido anhela la leche de su madre.

Rezo para que todos sigamos siendo transformados a la imagen de Cristo durante este tiempo de Pascua. Que aprendamos de nuestros neófitos que lavados por las aguas del bautismo nos llaman, como nuestra patrona Santa Teresa, a ser como niños de nuevo: inocentes y deseando las bendiciones más selectas de Dios.

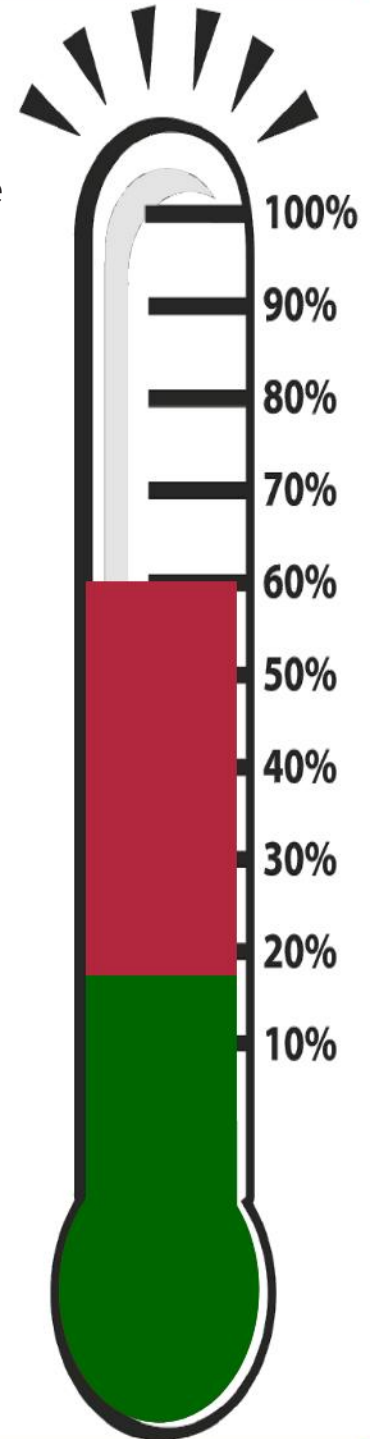
Centennial Project Updates

New Pews: In February, a sample pew with our selected wood, pew end design, and stain color was delivered and placed in the vestibule of the church. Though only one-seat wide, the sample was created to the exact scale of what the new pews will look and feel like. We have received the contract and are awaiting further fundraising progress to get that signed and locked in for installation prior to the Centennial Celebration in October 2026.

Church Organ: As of the printing of this bulletin, the final Organ contract is in the hands of the ADOM attorneys. We are on track to have the contract executed before Easter, guaranteeing a February 2026 delivery of the organ, so that it can be installed and voiced for the Centennial celebration in October 2026.

STS Multi-Purpose Center: Overall architectural design work continues while the project makes its way through the city's approval process. Updated renderings may be available before the end of the school year.
