I ask you to read this reflection and pray about how you approach the Mass every Sunday. Is it merely an obligation or a search for a genuine encounter with our Lord?

The Ancient Mass and the Call to Authentic Worship

What happens at Mass is not just a weekly routine or a personal devotion — it is an encounter with the living God, a participation in the worship of the early Church, and a foretaste of the heavenly liturgy. Suppose we ever doubt the importance of how we celebrate the liturgy. In that case, we need only turn to one of the earliest Christian witnesses, St. Justin Martyr, who described the Eucharist with striking clarity nearly 1,900 years ago.

In his First Apology, written in the second century, Justin provides a detailed account of the Eucharistic celebration. His description is remarkable — not just because it proves the ancient roots of our liturgical worship but also because it shows the intimate connection between the liturgy and the life of faith.

"Having ended the prayers, we salute one another with a kiss. There is then brought to the president of the brethren bread and a cup of wine mixed with water; and he taking them, gives praise and glory to the Father of the universe, through the name of the Son and of the Holy Ghost, and offers thanks at considerable length for our being counted worthy to receive these things at His hands." (First Apology, 65)

Even in the early years of the Church, the structure of the Mass was already in place: the assembly of believers, communal prayers, the Eucharistic

thanksgiving offered by the presiding minister, and the distribution of Holy Communion. What stands out most, however, is how the early Christians approached the liturgy—with awe, gratitude, and the conviction that it was essential to their salvation.

Justin does not present the Mass as something casual or adapted to personal preferences. Instead, he describes a solemn and ordered act of worship, one in which every part is directed toward God with reverence and devotion. The faithful did not simply attend; they actively participated, expressing their assent with the great "Amen" and receiving the Eucharist with a profound awareness of its significance.

This ancient testimony should challenge us today. The way we celebrate the liturgy shapes people's faith. When Mass is celebrated with beauty, dignity, and fidelity to the Church's tradition, it lifts the hearts of the faithful toward God and immerses them in the mystery of salvation. On the other hand, when the liturgy is treated as a performance, entertainment, or a mere obligation, it risks becoming something that people endure rather than encounter.

As ministers, musicians, lectors, and faithful participants, we must ask ourselves: Does our liturgical celebration reflect the reality that St. Justin and the early Christians knew? Do we approach the Eucharist as the most sacred moment of our day, or have we allowed routine and distraction to take hold?

The Eucharistic celebration is not just about preserving an ancient tradition but drawing souls into the mystery of Christ's sacrifice and resurrection. It is about forming disciples who, as Justin says, "may be counted worthy, now that we have learned the truth, by our works also to be found good citizens and keepers of the commandments."

This is why liturgy matters—and why doing it well matters. It is not for aesthetics or personal preference but because the way we worship shapes what we believe and how we live. The early Christians knew this. Do we?

Les pido que lean esta reflexión y recen sobre cómo abordan la Misa cada domingo. ¿Es simplemente una obligación o una búsqueda de un encuentro genuino con nuestro Señor?

La Misa Antigua y el Llamado a la Adoración Auténtica

Lo que sucede en la Misa no es solo una rutina semanal o una devoción personal, es un encuentro con Dios, una participación en el culto de la Iglesia primitiva y un anticipo de la liturgia celestial. Suponer siempre dudamos de la importancia de cómo celebramos la liturgia. En ese caso, sólo tenemos que recurrir a uno de los primeros testigos cristianos, San Justino Mártir, que describió la Eucaristía con sorprendente claridad hace casi 1,900 años.

En su Primera Apología, escrita en el siglo II, Justino ofrece un relato detallado de la celebración eucarística. Su descripción es notable, no solo porque demuestra las antiguas raíces de nuestro culto litúrgico, sino también porque muestra la íntima conexión entre la liturgia y la vida de fe.

"Una vez terminadas las oraciones, nos saludamos con un beso. Entonces se toma el pan y una copa de vino mezclado con agua; y tomándolas, da alabanza y gloria al Padre del universo, por el nombre del Hijo y del Espíritu Santo, y da gracias largamente por haber sido tenidos por dignos de recibir estas cosas de sus manos". (Primera Apología, 65)

Ya en los primeros años de la Iglesia, la estructura de la Misa ya estaba establecida: la asamblea de los creyentes, las oraciones comunitarias, la acción de gracias eucarística ofrecida por el ministro que presidía y la distribución de la Sagrada Comunión. Lo que más se

destaca, sin embargo, es cómo los primeros cristianos se acercaron a la liturgia: con asombro, gratitud y la convicción de que era esencial para su salvación.

Justin no presenta la misa como algo casual o adaptado a las preferencias personales. En cambio, describe un acto solemne y ordenado de adoración, uno en el que cada parte se dirige hacia Dios con reverencia y devoción. Los fieles no se limitaban a asistir; participaron activamente, expresando su asentimiento con el gran "Amén" y recibiendo la Eucaristía con una profunda conciencia de su significado.

Este antiguo testimonio debería interpelarnos hoy. La forma en que celebramos la liturgia da forma a la fe de las personas. Cuando la Misa se celebra con belleza, dignidad y fidelidad a la tradición de la Iglesia, eleva el corazón de los fieles hacia Dios y los sumerge en el misterio de la salvación. Por otra parte, cuando la liturgia es tratada como una representación, entretenimiento, o una mera obligación, corre el riesgo de convertirse en algo que la gente soporta en lugar de encontrar.

Como ministros, músicos, lectores y participantes fieles, debemos preguntarnos: ¿Nuestra celebración litúrgica refleja la realidad que San Justino y los primeros cristianos conocieron? ¿Nos acercamos a la Eucaristía como el momento más sagrado de nuestro día, o hemos permitido que la rutina y la distracción se apoderen de nosotros?

La celebración eucarística no se trata sólo de conservar una antigua tradición, sino de sumergir a las almas en el misterio del sacrificio y la resurrección de Cristo. Se trata de formar discípulos que, como dice Justino, "sean tenidos por dignos, ahora que hemos aprendido la verdad, para ser hallados también buenos ciudadanos y guardadores de los mandamientos por nuestras obras".

Esta es la razón por la que la liturgia es importante, y por la que es importante hacerla bien. No es por estética o preferencia personal, sino porque la forma en que adoramos da forma a lo que creemos y a cómo vivimos. Los primeros cristianos lo sabían. ¿Y nosotros?

Campaign Update

2025 marks a huge milestone in our history as we begin our two-year centennial celebration with St. Theresa School turning 100 this Fall!

Though we're excited to soon start the celebrations, plenty of work still remains ahead. Here are some of the latest updates on our Centennial projects:

- Our Pipe Organ is now being constructed at the Fisk Workshop in Gloucester, MA.
- Work on the interior of the church will commence in June. During the summer months, the balcony will be reinforced to support the weight of the new organ and the entire church will be repainted. The Reredos and side altars will be restored to their original beauty by dedicated artisans who will clean and touch up the many intricate details. The new pews will also be installed during this closure
- We'll soon be celebrating Mass in our original church, like our founding parishioners did, as we move to Comber Hall for all Masses during the summer construction.
- The STS Multipurpose Center has now received full approval from the City of Coral Gables Commission. The planning phase will now shift to the interior details ahead of the preparation of construction documents and an application for permitting.
- Our fundraising continues to steadily progress in both pledges and gifts received. Thank you to all who have already donated! With all our project plans approaching final approval and the start of work on the horizon, the time to give is now, ensuring that we stay on track with our timeline and, ideally, break ground at the school as it opens its doors for the 100th time in August.

THE LENTEN SCRUTINIES

Excerpts taken from The Catholic Company Magazine

Over the next three weekends, at the 10:30am Mass, we will celebrate the Lenten Scrutinies, three special rites that help prepare the Elect to enter the Catholic Church on Easter. The purpose of the Rites is *"to uncover, then heal all that is weak, defective, or sinful"* in the hearts of the Elect and to *"strengthen all that is upright, strong, and good."*

After the Gospel and Homily, the Elect and their Sponsors will come forward during each of the three weeks of the Scrutinies. The Celebrant addresses the whole assembly, asking us to pray for a spirit of repentance, an awareness of sin, and strength of will for the Elect. He prays for them as we pray for them. While this is happening, we can also recognize the need to seek these same graces in prayer for our own continuous conversion. The Priest then lays hands on each of the Elect individually, and he prays silently over them. Among other intentions, he prays an exorcism prayer, asking God to strengthen and protect them from temptation and deceit. We can use this time to pray silently for our brothers and sisters in Christ, and to ask that we not fall victim to temptation or deceit as we aspire to love God more deeply, and conform ourselves to Him.

During the Scrutinies these next three weeks, ask yourself: *what is defective in my heart and soul that needs strengthening?* Resolve to ask for God's healing grace, go to Confession, and work prayerfully on those areas of your spiritual life. Please also continue to pray for our Elect as they enter this final period of preparation!

MEN'S EMMAUS RETREAT #52

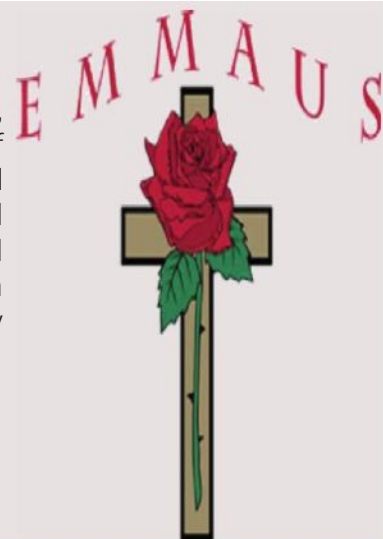

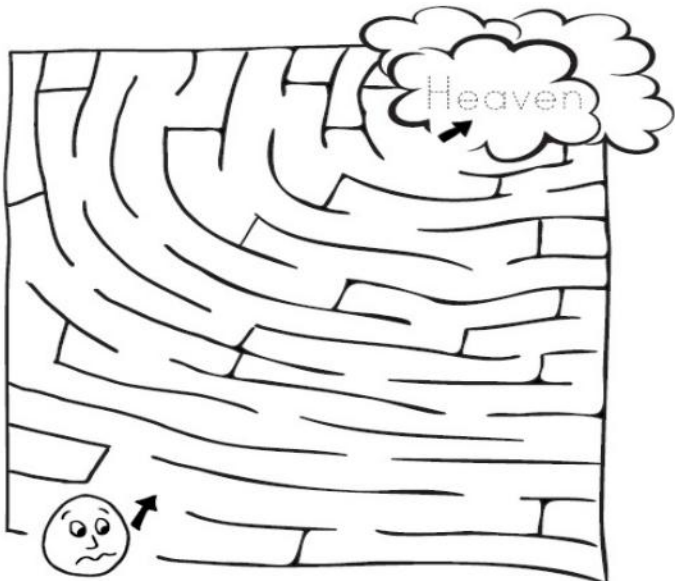

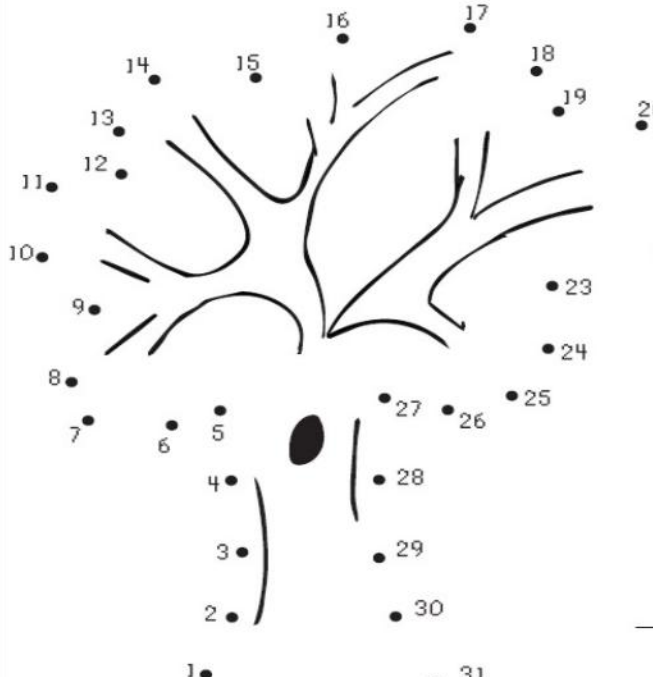
Saint Perpetua and Saint Felicity
