FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

My Dear Friends,

"I rejoiced when they said to me, Let us go to the house of the LORD." (Psalm 122:1)

This was the hymn that Jewish pilgrims would sing in Old Testament times on their pilgrim journeys up to Jerusalem. Today, we join that ancient hymn as we return to our church for the first time in five months to participate in the most important thing that we do as a parish: the celebration of Sunday Mass. It has been a long summer away from this sacred space, and I am overjoyed that we can share all the work that was done to repair, restore, and beautify our church in the last five months.

A few weeks ago, I exhorted all of you to prepare the temple of your hearts for this day in the same way that we were preparing this physical temple. We walk into this magnificent church today as a pilgrim people always in search of the Divine, restless to journey to God. I pray that everything that was done to the church elevates your senses to encounter the Living God in the Holy Eucharist.

In the following pages, our parish staff has prepared a detailed explanation as to what was done over the summer. Some things are obvious; most things are subtle. But the one thing that has not changed is that the center and the primary focus of this church continues to be our altar of sacrifice where your priests offer Mass at least three times every day on that glorious and consecrated marble altar worthy of our Lord.

Thank you all for your generosity in pledging and giving to the Centennial Campaign which made all of this possible. Keep those gifts coming because there are still many bills to be paid. Also, there is more work to be done while we continue to worship in the church. The balcony continues to be prepared for the arrival of our organ in February. That work will be done during weekdays when Mass is not being celebrated. This will require us to close the church for private prayer from 8:45am – 5:00pm on weekdays for the next couple of months, but we can go pray in our Adoration Chapel. We also have to finish other details such as the refurbishment of our fourth confessional on the right of the church which could not be done this summer and is sorely needed.

But again, what is truly important, the day we have all longed for is finally here: we get to reenter the house of the Lord! This holy place set aside in 1951 for divine worship which rises majestically to the heavens in this corner of God's Kingdom. Where so many of you were baptized, received First Communion, were confirmed, got married, where you have been absolved, and where you encounter the Real Presence of Jesus Christ in body, soul, and divinity every time you kneel before the tabernacle and offer sacrifice during the celebration of the Eucharist. My friends, we are home!

Mís Querídos Amígos,

"Que alegría cuando me díferon: "Vamos a la casa del Señor" (Salmo 122:1).

Este era el himno que los peregrinos judíos cantaban en tiempos del Antiguo Testamento durante sus peregrinaciones a Jerusalén. Hoy, nos unimos a ese antiguo himno al regresar a nuestra iglesia por primera vez en cinco meses para participar en lo más importante que hacemos como parroquia: la celebración de la Misa dominical. Ha sido un largo verano exiliados de este lugar sagrado, y me llena de alegría poder compartir todo el trabajo realizado para reparar, restaurar y embellecer nuestra iglesia en los últimos cinco meses.

Hace unas semanas, los exhorté a todos a preparar el templo de sus corazones para este día, de la misma manera que preparábamos este templo físico. Entramos hoy en esta magnífica iglesia como un pueblo peregrino, siempre en busca de lo Divino, con el anhelo de caminar hacia Dios. Ruego que todo lo realizado en la iglesia eleve sus sentidos para que puedan encontrarse con el Dios vivo en la Sagrada Eucaristía.

En las siguientes páginas, nuestro equipo parroquial ha preparado una explicación detallada de las obras realizadas durante el verano. Algunas son evidentes; la mayoría son más sutiles. Pero lo que no ha cambiado es que el centro y la esencia de esta iglesia sigue siendo nuestro altar de sacrificio, donde sus sacerdotes ofrecen la Misa al menos tres veces al día en ese glorioso y consagrado altar de mármol, digno de nuestro Señor.

Gracias a todos por su generosidad al comprometerse a la Campaña del Centenario y contribuir a ella, lo que hizo posible todo esto. Les pedimos que continúen enviando sus donaciones, ya que aún hay muchas facturas por pagar. Además, hay más trabajo por hacer mientras seguimos celebrando la liturgia en la iglesia. Se sigue preparando el balcón para la llegada de nuestro órgano en febrero. Este trabajo se realizará entre semana, cuando no haya Misa. Esto requerirá que cerremos la iglesia para la oración personal de 8:45 a. m. a 5:00 p. m. de lunes a viernes en los próximos meses, pero podemos ir a rezar en la capilla de adoración. También tenemos que ultimar otros detalles, como la renovación de nuestro cuarto confesionario, a la derecha de la iglesia, que no se pudo realizar este verano y que urge.

Pero, de nuevo, lo más importante: ¡el día que todos hemos anhelado por fin ha llegado! ¡Volvemos a entrar en la casa del Señor! Este lugar santo, consagrado en 1951 al culto divino, que se eleva majestuosamente hasta los cielos en este rincón del Reino de Dios. Donde muchos de ustedes fueron bautizados, recibieron la Primera Comunión, la Confirmación, se casaron, donde fueron absueltos y donde tienen un encuentro con la Presencia Real de Jesucristo en cuerpo, alma y divinidad cada vez que se arrodillan ante el sagrario y ofrecen el sacrificio durante la celebración de la Eucaristía. ¡Amigos, al fin, estamos en casa!



WELCOME HOME!

As you walk into the church for the first time in 5 months today, you may look around and initially think to yourself, "What changed? Something is different, but I'm not sure what it is." Nothing would make us happier! As we set out to renovate and restore the church, our guiding principle was always ensuring that whatever we did to the church, make it seem like it had always been that way. Over these next few pages, we'll highlight some of the work that was performed this summer, along with some "before" photos so you can compare.

Having been away for 5 months, you may not remember exactly what it looked like originally!



COLORS

Among the more obvious or evident aspects of the projects is the fresh coat of paint throughout the interior of the church. The new color scheme of the walls was selected to better complement the decorative reredos above the altar. The natural hues of tan and yellow help to foster a warmer ambiance in the church, reflecting not only the light of Christ, but the warmth of our welcoming community. The accent colors also work to naturally draw your attention forward towards the sanctuary and up towards heaven. Looking from the main entrance at the west end and working your way east, you'll notice the capitals at the tops of the columns grow in scale, decoration, and weight of colors, moving from a simple gold detail to a more ornate capital with golds, reds, and more intricate shading. Your eyes will be naturally drawn next to the new decorative friezes at the top of the transept walls, ultimately leading you to the beautiful reredos and the new Holy Spirit Dome. This natural movement toward the Divine is an essential aspect of good church architecture!

REREDOS AND STDE ALTARS

The main reredos above the altar may look like it was freshly painted, but in reality, the bulk of the work on it was a deep cleaning to remove years of incense, candle soot, and dust. Once cleaned, small areas of the plaster were repaired and repainted and the more detailed paint lines and shading accents were crisped up, giving it a "new" appearance. What you see today is nearly identical to what you last saw on June 8th, with a lot less dust!

The side altars of the Blessed Virgin Mary, St. Joseph, St. Therese and St. Anthony are a different story! With 75 years of flower and candle offerings, the altars and statues alike were badly in need of repair. All 4 statues were professionally touched up by a local artist and the 4 altars had major plaster work done. The two altars in the vestibule had to be dropped 11 inches to avoid the ceiling, which previously cut off the top outside corner of the decorative molding. All 4 side altars were repainted from scratch, with colors selected to match the main reredos in the sanctuary. The gold accents connect the side altars to the overall scheme of the church and the brighter bases and rear panels really make the statues stand out, helping us to appreciate the fine details and craftsmanship of each one.



DOME



Internally, one of our favorite aspects of the whole project is the new Holy Spirit dome. As you look up into the glorious new dome, you may have a hard time remembering what was there previously: nothing!

The blank canvas of the original dome was begging for something beautiful and the artists at John Canning Liturgical Arts certainly delivered. The new oculus at the base of the dome provides a natural transition from the heavily decorated reredos and upper capitals to the shimmering metallic gold of the dome itself. The cream vertical tiles are original to the dome and were left unpainted, providing both a nod to our history and a sense of connection between heaven above and earth below. The jewel of the dome, of course, is the new mosaic of the Holy Spirit, a reminder that everything we celebrate in church is an outpouring of Grace through the movement of Spirit, which will now be flying overhead for the next century and beyond!

CEILINGS, WINDOWS, AND ACOUSTICAL WORK

Looking up around the dome, you may notice something else strikingly new and different, the solid-painted ceilings. The material of the original ceilings, tectum board, is sound-absorbing and was originally installed to dampen the acoustics of the building. After professional acoustical testing of the space, though, it was determined that the new organ and choir loft would need much livelier acoustics in the room. All the tectum board in the central nave was encapsulated and the entire ceiling was then painted to match the beautiful pre-existing rafters. The treated ceilings throughout the building now serve to not only enhance the acoustics, but also to help keep your vision from wandering, allowing you to appreciate the finer architectural details overhead.

The stained-glass windows were all cleaned and the mullions and muntins were all reglazed and repainted black, which both accentuate the rich colors of the stained glass and also highlight the iconic window shapes that are now memorialized on each of our new pew ends.

Additionally, special acoustical panels were applied to the new facing of the choir loft and a new stone cap and wrought-iron railing will soon be installed atop that loft wall.





THE HIDDEN GEMS

For all the visible work performed that will be enjoyed by parishioners for generations to come, there is probably twice as much hidden work known only to staff, contractors, engineers, architects - and now you!

Though not nearly as glamorous as the beautiful finished details, these hidden parts of the project were some of the most essential.

If you sit underneath the choir loft or stand at the vestibule and look up, you may notice a newly finished ceiling. Just beyond that surface is a major steel reinforcement package that had to be carefully hoisted into place in order to support the 39,000-pound pipe organ which will arrive in February. The 48-foot span of the primary steel beam at the face of the balcony required the careful coordination of 3 forklifts and a team of laborers to carefully guide it and secure it in place. The two new columns by the main iron gate, pending their decorative covers (coming soon!), provide additional support while another 10 steel cross-beams create the reinforcing footprint, perfectly in line with the steel framing of the organ and choir loft flooring above.

Astute observers may be able to find some new floor tiles spread throughout the building. Upon removal of the old pews, hundreds of tiny holes needed to be refilled. Decades of wear and tear had also resulted in broken or pitted marble tiles, all of which were filled in, repaired, or completely replaced, in the nave and sanctuary alike. All the marble was then finely polished before our beautiful new solid wood pews arrived and were installed.





REMAINING WORK

The sprint to November 1st was a massive undertaking and we are incredibly appreciative of our entire team for rising to the challenge. The work highlighted in these pages is only a small sample of all the incredibly detailed work that was performed throughout this past summer. As you enjoy our beautiful church again today, please note that we are not entirely finished. Work will continue with some finishing details downstairs and ongoing preparatory work upstairs in the choir loft, ahead of the arrival of the new pipe organ on February 1st, 2026.
