

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

My Dear Friends,

Today we celebrate the Feast of the Dedication of the Lateran Basilica in Rome. This is the cathedral of Rome. and since the Pope is the bishop of Rome, it is the cathedral of the Universal Church. We celebrate this feast to remind us that we are one, holy, Catholic, and apostolic Church in communion with our Holy Father as we rejoice over the dedication of our mother church in the Eternal City. This feast also serves as a reminder that we are the Church. It is not a building or a faraway building in Rome, but the Church is made up of living stones, the people of God, who in communion with Christ and with those he has entrusted with the care of his flock are called to build up the Kingdom of God here on earth.

We are reminded that as a Church we are called to build upon the foundation that Our Savior left for us. He founded the Church and the apostles and all who came In short, we are called to reflect this magnificent, after built on that foundation. Here in this particular church that was founded almost 100 years ago, we continue to build upon the foundation left by the founders of this great parish community. The work that they did back then laid the framework for what we are doing today as a parish during our centennial year. Obviously, we gather together for Mass in this beautiful church that our founders labored to build, and we enjoy the fruits of their labor, but what are we leaving for future generations? As I asked last weekend in my homily: what story will we write in this chapter of our parish's history.

Because we are the living Church, we never stop in building up the kingdom of God, and this goes beyond was done in our physical church over the summer. There are so many of your brothers and sisters here in this parish who labor in God's vineyard and perform great acts of charity without anyone even noticing. In the coming weeks, we will see many people work in putting together a Mass in our schoolyard to celebrate the 100th anniversary of St. Theresa with the archbishop. Our Homeless Ministry will be working tirelessly to make sure poor families get a proper Thanksgiving meal.

In less than a month, an army of volunteers will welcome thousands of people who will come to our church to venerate the relics of St. Therese. And finally, later that same week, another army of volunteers working at the Parish Fair and laboring far from view whose jobs are no less important: those who stay behind at night to pick up trash, those who wake up early to buy the food, those who perform tiny acts of charity to help these days go by smoother. But beyond these events, in the day-to-day life of this parish, so many wonderful people build up the kingdom with only their Heavenly Father noticing. We have those who lead Bible Studies, oversee prayer groups, teach Religious Education. We also have an group of dedicated parishioners who visit the sick and bring the love that we share in this church on Sundays and the Holy Eucharist into people's homes. All of this is a reminder that this is your parish, and you are the Church.

refurbished temple where God resides. When I was a child, whenever we would go to Mass on Sunday, it was never lost on me that this was God's house and this is where God lived. But as a Church, we cannot confine ourselves to these walls. This is something that both Pope Leo and Pope Francis before him have repeated time and again. If as a Church we are truly called to reflect this temple where God dwells, then we must be living temples of God's presence out there in the world. The question and the challenge I leave with you this day as we celebrate what it means to be part of the Church is this: "What am I doing to contribute to the work of our beloved Church of the Little Flower?"

DEL ESCRITORIO DEL PARROCO

Mís Querídos Amígos,

Hoy celebramos la Fiesta de la Dedicación de la Basílica de San Juan de Letrán en Roma. Esta es la catedral de Roma, y dado que el Papa es el obispo de Roma, es la catedral de la Iglesia Universal. Celebramos esta fiesta para recordar que somos una Iglesia santa, católica y apostólica, en comunión con nuestro Santo Padre, al tiempo que nos regocijamos por la dedicación de nuestra iglesia madre en la Ciudad Eterna. Esta fiesta también nos recuerda que nosotros somos la Iglesia. No se trata de un edificio, ni de un edificio lejano en Roma, sino que la Iglesia está formada por piedras vivas, el pueblo de Dios, que, en comunión con Cristo y con aquellos a quienes Él ha confiado el cuidado de su grey, están llamados a edificar el Reino de Dios aquí en la tierra.

Recordamos que, como Iglesia, estamos llamados a edificar sobre el fundamento que nos dejó nuestro Salvador. Él fundó la Iglesia, y los apóstoles y todos los que vinieron después edificaron sobre ese fundamento. Aquí, en esta iglesia en particular, fundada hace casi cien años, continuamos edificando sobre el fundamento dejado por los fundadores de esta gran comunidad parroquial. El trabajo que realizaron entonces sentó las bases de lo que hacemos hoy como parroquia en nuestro centenario. Obviamente, nos reunimos para la Misa en esta hermosa iglesia que nuestros fundadores construyeron con tanto esfuerzo, y disfrutamos de los frutos de su trabajo, pero ¿qué legado dejamos a las futuras generaciones? ¿Qué historia vamos a nosotros escribir en este capítulo de la historia de nuestra parroquia?

Como Iglesia viva, nunca cesamos en la construcción del Reino de Dios, y esto va más allá de lo que se hizo en nuestra iglesia durante el verano. Hay muchos hermanos y hermanas aquí en esta parroquia que trabajan en la viña del Señor y realizan grandes obras de caridad sin que nadie lo note. En las próximas semanas, veremos a muchos trabajando organizar una Misa en el patio de nuestra escuela para celebrar el centenario de la Escuela de Santa Teresa con el arzobispo. Nuestro Ministerio de Personas Desamparadas trabajará incansablemente para asegurar que las familias necesitadas reciban una cena digna para el Día de Acción de Gracias.

En menos de un mes, un gran número de voluntarios recibirá a miles de personas que vendrán a nuestra iglesia a venerar las reliquias de Santa Teresita. Y finalmente, más tarde esa misma semana, otro ejército de voluntarios trabajara en la Feria Parroquial, laborando lejos de la vista, con una dedicación no menos importante: quienes se quedan hasta tarde recogiendo basura, quienes se levantan temprano para comprar la comida, quienes realizan pequeños actos de caridad para que estos días transcurrieran con mayor facilidad. Pero más allá de estos eventos, en el día a día de esta parroquia, muchas personas maravillosas edifican el reino y su Padre Celestial lo nota. Tenemos a quienes dirigen estudios bíblicos, supervisan grupos de oración e imparten catequesis. También contamos con un grupo de feligreses dedicados que visitan a los enfermos y llevan el amor que compartimos en esta iglesia los domingos y la Sagrada Eucaristía a los hogares. Todo esto nos recuerda que esta es nuestra parroquia y que nosotros somos la Iglesia.

En resumen, estamos llamados a reflejar este magnífico templo restaurado donde reside Dios. Cuando era niño, cada vez que íbamos a misa los domingos, siempre tenía presente que esta era la casa de Dios y que aquí vivía Dios. Pero como Iglesia, no podemos confinarnos entre estas paredes. Esto es algo que tanto el Papa León como el Papa Francisco, antes que él, han repetido una y otra vez. Si como Iglesia estamos verdaderamente llamados a reflejar este templo donde mora Dios, entonces debemos ser templos vivientes de la presencia de Dios en el mundo. La pregunta y el reto que les dejo hoy, al celebrar lo que significa ser parte de la Iglesia, es este: "¿Qué estoy haciendo para contribuir a la obra de nuestra amada Iglesia de Santa Teresita?"


PARISH PILGRIMAGE TO BOSTON/GLOUCESTER FOR THE GRAND UNVEILING OF FISK OPUS 166!


Today, we are celebrating the Pope's church building. Do you know who the Pope is?
